Coming Soon From the Catholic Conference of Ohio

Last February, the Ohio bishops issued their **FIRST STATEMENT** informing us of the upcoming ballot initiative to expand and enshrine access to abortion for any reason into

Ohio's Constitution. Last May, most parishes passed along a **FLYER** and **PRAYER CARDS** from the CCO on the ballot issue, and they also released the new website **PROTECT OHIO** with various resources to educate people on the dangers of the issue. We are also coalition members of **PROTECT WOMEN OHIO**, that exists to help defeat the initiative through commercials and other education pieces. Most recently, the Archbishop

released his statement on Issue 1, which while not specifically about the abortion ballot issue, certainly has implications on the ease or difficulty proponents will have in passing it this November. What else can we expect from the Ohio Bishops in the coming weeks and months to help defeat this issue?

First, starting in August, pastors will be given guidance on how to incorporate the readings of the Sunday to points on Church teaching related to the dignity of life, and why we ought to vote "No" in November. There will be two more Sundays in October and one in November. Pastors are always free to make different choices at their parishes, but the Ohio bishops are giving them the tools they

need to talk about the issues at the pulpit in line with the readings of the day.

Secondly, a new flyer titled "Where Does It Say That?" will be sent to all parishes in mid-August, to be used in bulletins, websites and social media pages. As the title suggests, it specifically points out the places in the amendment language that leads to the claims we make about an end to parental rights,

safety rules related to abortion, and a right to abortion in all 9 months of pregnancy. In September, a second flyer will be released on Frequently Asked Questions.

On September 15, a 54-day rosary novena will begin for all the faithful in Ohio. Every Catholic will be invited to pray one set of mysteries of the rosary each day until election day, to defeat the ballot initiative and in thanksgiving for its defeat. This will include the launch ite with specific provers for

of a novena website with specific prayers for each mystery. Easily sharable social media and bulletin announcements about this novena will come out in mid-August, ensuring everyone is aware and ready to begin on September 15.

High-quality, shareable videos will be produced locally from people with lived experience about the dangers of abortion and why we don't need this amendment to protect care for women who have a miscarriage or ectopic pregnancy.

Of course, there will be similar pushes to register to vote, information on how to vote early, and other related pieces throughout September and October. Once we have a proposition number, an official vote "No" logo will be designed and available to print on yard signs, put in bulletins and share on websites and social media.

I am not an election historian, but I cannot imagine that there has ever been an election in the state of Ohio with more dire consequences at stake. We must step outside of our like-minded friend bubbles and help our "pro-choice" friends and neighbors understand that this is not what they want either. Let us put our faith into action, and evangelize those with whom we come into contact, that by the grace of God we may defeat this amendment and save so many mothers, children and families from this culture of death.

Ohio's new budget was approved last month, and included several items supported by the Catholic Conference of Ohio (CCO) that help support pregnant women, children and families.

Perhaps the piece most are already aware of is the expansion of Ohio's EdChoice Scholarship Program, now available to all Ohioans who wish to send their children to a Catholic school. Most families can receive the full scholarship of \$6,165 for grade school and \$8,407 for high school. Full details can be found on the **OHIO DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION** website.

In addition to the EdChoice expansion, the approved budget included a number of family-friendly items which the CCO advocated for such as: eliminating sales tax for baby products; investing more in housing for vulnerable pregnant women; extending Ohio Works First cash assistance eligibility for the full duration of a woman's pregnancy; a new doula program to address infant and maternal mortality rates, especially in minority communities; supporting pregnancy resource centers; expanding Medicaid for pregnant women and children; reforming Ohio adoption law and increasing the child tax credit.

Walking With Moms in Need

Last summer, our parish family, Mary Queen of Heaven, began to explore the USCCB **WALKING WITH MOMS IN NEED** initiative. The early stages of this initiative calls for identifying "gaps" or missing elements in

helping those in need within our community. A few of the major gaps we discovered are accompaniment after childbirth, childcare financial assistance, and knowing that there are resources available and how to access them. In the process, we also were made aware that dads in unusual circumstances and parents receiving a poor perinatal diagnosis have needs as well.

Upon identifying these gaps we were able to share resources with parishes and high schools, connect with local ministries, and train volunteers as advocates at Heaven's Gain Ministry. Our parish family is also exploring a national baby shower program modeling how a parish provides a baby shower for a woman and her family. In collaboration with St. Ignatius Parish, MQH will host their first baby shower in October 2023!

Ongoing programs are also in development Including "Angel Friends" to accompany moms, a spiritual adoption campaign for the parishes/ schools launching on August 15, as well as an advertising campaign to help moms in need find resources that already exist. A long-term goal is to find a way to assist moms in need with child care expenses, a major stated need for women with unexpected pregnancies.



Being Pro-Life New Life Through Death

Victoria was а beautiful high school girl who loved games volleyball, and arm-wrestling her brother. Just two weeks after her 15th birthday she woke-up with a headache and passed out. She was eventually diagnosed



with a malignant form of brain cancer known as Gioblastoma, which took her life 14 months later. While it was easy to see what was so wonderful about Victoria while she was healthy, it was in death that what was most beautiful about Victoria was made so apparent. When brain cancer whittled away at so many of her abilities, what was never taken away was her immense sense of gratitude, her faith, and her concern for those most in need. I challenge all of us to truly pray for the women in unplanned pregnancies, that through the Holy Spirit, they are met with the love and support that they need to choose life for their babies whether through parenting, adoption, kinship care, co-parenting, etc. As mentioned in the article on page 3, **WALKING WITH MOMS IN NEED** is a great way to encourage prayer and action in our parishes. You may never know how your prayers and support can change someone's life and save another.

Thirty-three years ago, on July 26th the Americans with Disabilities Act was signed into law. The ADA is a civil rights law that prohibits discrimination against individuals with disabilities in all areas of public life, including jobs, schools, transportation, and all places that are open to the general public. This changed the course of life for so many! As a church, we are legally exempted from that law in many instances, but at the same time, we should be reaching out and going above and beyond what the law requires.



The Office for Persons with Disabilities advocates for those who benefit from this important law in your parish. How accessible is your parish for those who are blind, deaf, hard of hearing, or have a cognitive or intellectual disability? Do you offer braille missiles and support for the blind, ASL for the Deaf Community, FM or Loop devices for the hard of hearing, and Sensory Friendly Mass for those with autism, dementia, or Alzheimer's?
