November's Election is Just Two Months Away

We have about two months left in our efforts to defeat this dangerous and extreme ballot


initiative in November. Last month I outlined some of the resources that are coming from the Catholic Conference of Ohio to educate the faithful about this issue. What else do we need to do?

First, continue to pray and fast. As I mentioned in the April issue, you are invited to say a quick prayer with your family every day at 7:14 (AM and PM). That time is based on 2 CHRONICLES 7:14.

Additionally, the website is now up for the 54-Day Rosary Novena starting on September 15. You can find the webpage at CATHOLICAOC. ORG/PRAY540HIO. The website will be updated each day of the novena with a different saint. Be sure to share that in your bulletins and pulpit announcements so everyone knows about it and participates as they are able. Do not forget that fasting is also a key component, as Jesus reminded us in MARK 9:29. Your fasting can be as strict as our Ash Wednesday requirements, or as simple as forgoing sugar in your coffee, but

please do *something*. If we unite a personal sacrifice with the immense sacrifice of Christ,

the graces bestowed on us from our prayers will be multiplied.



will also offer a different training for anyone to simply learn how to talk to your neighbor. Polls indicate that most Ohioans will vote "yes" on this amendment based on what they think it is about, but even most pro-choice people are against what this amendment actually does. That is why we need to know how to talk to our pro-choice friends on the truth of this amendment. Both of these trainings will be offered the week of September 11. Third, please donate. We know we will not match the other side dollar-for-dollar in ad campaigns, but we must try to reach who we can most especially with targeted ads that dispel the myths that will be told about threats to access to miscarriage and ectopic pregnancy care. If you can, give directly to **PROTECT WOMEN OHIO**, to help fund the high cost of an effective advertising campaign.

Finally, share the local videos we are creating right here in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. We have **ALREADY RELEASED THE FIRST** of 6 high quality homily videos short enough for sharing on social media. We are also creating videos from lawyers, doctors and others with personal stories to dispel the common lies that will be told by those who support this amendment. You will find all of these videos, as they come out, at **ARCHDIOCESE OF CINCINNATI - YOUTUBE.** They will also be posted on the **ARCHDIOCESAN** and the **RESPECT LIFE OFFICE** facebook pages. Share them on your parish and personal social media accounts. Then share them again.

Get the word out as much as possible for people to Vote "No" in November. If we want to keep this out of Ohio, we need to not only win, but win big.




Respect Life Coordinator Resources

40 Days Fall Campaigns

The Beginning of the End of Abortion



Beginning September 27, people across the world will gather outside abortion facilities once again to lift their voices in prayer for those who enter, the workers who provide abortion services, and the innocent lives lost. Those who commit to these 40 days of prayer and fasting, do so peacefully in the hope that someday we will see a world where the killing of unborn children is unthinkable.

As the most extreme abortion amendment to ever enter Ohio looms before us this November, I encourage you to get involved. If you have never prayed outside of an abortion clinic, attend one of the upcoming vigils and sign up for an hour or two. If you have volunteered before, consider becoming a day captain and help recruit others to fill needed slots. And don't forget the fasting portion. Like we all do during Lent, commit to a specific sacrifice during the 40 Days vigil, such as giving up phone games or sweetener in your morning cup of coffee.

If you are unable to physically join the vigil, you can still join us in prayer. Offer a rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet each day, or a daily Mass each week. The battle to end abortion begins with changing hearts, and prayer is our best weapon. Sign up for a local vigil at **WWW.40DAYSFORLIFE.**

ASL interpreters will be interpreting Mass, followed by a meeting and fellowship.



and exchange information in breakout "rooms." Participants will also be sent short summaries and contact information for each organization.



Capital Punishment and Forgiveness

Bill's grandmother was attacked by a group of teen girls who skipped school one afternoon, looking for money to play arcade games. They entered her home, stabbed her to death, but only found \$10 and the keys to



her car. The trial ended with one of the teens, being sentenced to death, and Bill watched stone faced as her grandfather was led out of the courtroom for his outbursts of, "They're going to kill my baby." After months of being unable to get that image out of his head, Bill realized his grandmother would never have wanted a grandfather to watch his own grandchild die. Safe Haven Baby Boxes

Safe Haven laws, also known as "Baby Moses Laws" have been around in *all* 50 states since 2008. "What exactly are these laws?" you may ask. The Safe Haven laws allow parents to surrender their small infants anonymously without legal ramifications. The babies are often surrendered at firehouses, hospitals, or police stations. These facilities are catching onto the trend of

installing "baby boxes." The temperature-controlled secure boxes allow the parents to remain anonymous and notifies personnel once the box is opened from the outside. A staff member is able to get to the baby within 3 minutes and then immediately take the child to the hospital for care. These babies are then placed for adoption by the state. Because of these boxes, the number of babies abandoned has decreased immensely. That was the goal of Monica Kelsey, who worked to get a box installed in our own tri-state area at the Delhi Township Fire Department, for a reason very personal to her.
