I have always felt God's presence and have seen His forgiveness touch others lives. "The women of Project Rachel supported me lovingly, and started me on the path to healing. God forgave me but I still had to forgive myself, a friend said "if God forgives you, who are you not to accept His forgiveness, and then forgive yourself...God does not want you to be broken He wants you to be the Holy person he created you to be." I have forgiven myself, I pray for and to my baby, I try to stay focused on the positive, not on things that I cannot change, I'm grateful for the graces to journey along daily." Geri
