DEPARTMENT OF LABOR ISSUES NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING TO UPDATE OVERTIME REGULATIONS

On March 7, 2019 the Department of Labor announced a proposed rule that would make over a million more American workers eligible for overtime. Under currently enforced wage-hour law, employees with a salary below \$455 per week (\$23,660 annually) must be paid overtime if they work more than 40 hours per week. This salary level was set in 2004. This proposed rule would boost the salary level to \$679 per week (equivalent to \$35,308 per year). Above this salary level, eligibility for overtime varies based on job duties. More information about the proposed rule is available at www.dol.gov/whd/overtime2019.
