### **MILEAGE RATE INCREASE FOR 2019**

The Archbishop has approved a mileage reimbursement rate of .58 per mile for business use of your personal auto. The new rate applies to miles driven in 2019. Reimbursement for miles driven in 2018 will be at .545.

### **RECORDS FROM CLOSED CHURCHES**

In the past when churches have closed, records of those churches often went to another nearby parish. This includes sacramental registers, parish histories, financials, membership records, photographs, programs, student transcripts, etc. The Archives of the Archdiocese would like to invite these parishes to transfer the closed parish and school records to the Archives. ## **OHIO MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE**

On January 1, 2019, the Ohio minimum wage will increase to \$8.55 per hour. The minimum wage increase is the result of a constitutional amendment passed by voters in November 2006. The amendment requires the Ohio minimum wage to increase on January 1 of each year by the rate of inflation. The increase is tied to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the prior 12 month period as of September 30, 2018.
