GUIDELINES FOR THE ANNUAL RESPECT LIFE COLLECTION

In 1973, on the recommendation of the Archdiocesan Pastoral Council, an annual collection was established to provide financial support to dozens of life-giving and life-sustaining organizations located within the 19 counties of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. The collection will be held at Masses the first weekend in October, October 5-6. One hundred percent of all monies collected are forwarded to the Chancery Office and designated for the Respect Life Fund. A small portion of these funds assist in sustaining Project Rachel and other Respect Life programs of the Archdiocese, and the balance is designated for Respect Life Grants. Applications are evaluated by the Respect Life Grant Committee, facilitated by the Director of the Office for Respect Life Ministries. Recommendations are provided to the Archbishop's Office for final approval. Funds are disbursed in January of the following year.

The following guidelines are provided for parishes regarding our annual Respect Life collection:

- 1. We highly encourage parishes to give to this fund so that we can support the many local agencies doing great work here in the Archdiocese, as well as our Project Rachel postabortion healing ministry. It is, however, completely voluntary.
- 2. If you take up a second collection on that day, and it is not given to the Archdiocesan Respect Life Fund, be sure it is made known to your parishioners exactly where the proceeds are being sent.
- 3. If you give all or some of the money you collect on that day to some other pro-life organization, we ask you to provide a simple report to the Office for Respect Life Ministries on how much was collected and to what agency the money was given. This information simply needs to be taken into consideration should that same organization apply for additional funding through the Respect Life Fund.

The 2020 Official Catholic Directory (OCD) updates will be completed online, as has been the case for the past couple of years. It is imperative that all parishes, schools, and organizations listed in the Official Catholic Directory complete the online update for the 2020 edition.

NEW NORMS FOR EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION

Archbishop Schnurr has approved the following additional norms, effective immediately, for EMsHC in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati:

- 1. Extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion can and should purify the pyxes they use in ministry to the sick, hospitalized, and homebound.
- 2. Extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion with surplus consecrated hosts after visiting the sick, homebound or hospitalized may reverently consume the surplus hosts if it is inconvenient for the ministers to bring the surplus hosts back to a tabernacle. Ministers should continue to take care that enough consecrated hosts are brought for the communicants, but not to bring excess insofar as it is possible.

DEPARTMENT OF LABOR FINAL OVERTIME RULE

On September 24, 2019, the U.S. Department of Labor (DOL) issued the long-anticipated final overtime rule. Here are the highlights of the final rule:

- 1. **The annual salary threshold for exempt positions** will jump from \$23,660 to \$35,568 (or from \$455 to \$684 per week). With the exception of teachers and the clergy, employees who earn less than the threshold must be paid for over 40 hours worked in a workweek at a rate not less than time and one-half their regular hourly pay rate—even if they're currently classified as a manager or professional and regardless of whether they are full or part-time.
- 2. There will be no change in the duties test used to determine whether employees earning more than the salary threshold must be classified as non-exempt from overtime, including the exemptions for executive, administrative and professional positions, among others.
- 3. The new rule takes effect on <u>January 1, 2020</u>.

Please use the above effective date as a timeline for implementing any needed changes to your exempt/non-exempt classifications.

Important: If you have not done so already, we strongly recommend that you analyze the number of hours worked per week/month/year for each employee who is currently classified as exempt and whose salary is below \$35,568 per year. This analysis is necessary so that an accurate hourly rate can be established when the employee is converted to non-exempt status. In other words, the goal is to set an hourly rate that will, as closely as possible, result in the employee being paid the same yearly salary as they are currently paid. Please pay close attention to any overtime hours (i.e., hours over 40 per week) that the employee works, as these hours will need to be factored into the setting of the hourly rate. By way of example, an employee who regularly works five hours of overtime per week will require the setting of a lower hourly rate to offset the overtime premium of "time and a half" for each hour of overtime.

LANGUAGE TO BE ADDED TO JOB DESCRIPTIONS

As reported previously, in an effort to further clarify our employees' work relationship with the church, the Archbishop has requested that all at-will (i.e., non-teachers) job descriptions contain the following paragraph in the Working Environment section of job descriptions.

Please see the highlighted revision to the job description language:

"Employees of _____ Catholic Church will have knowledge of the Catholic faith, a willingness to work for a Catholic, faith-based agency and adhere to the policies of _____ Catholic Church. Employees will not publicly oppose the teachings of the Catholic faith nor publicly advocate for any position in conflict with Catholic teaching, or the specific positions of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati or the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops with regard to Catholic teaching. This requirement includes any public speech, demonstration or writing including the use of social media or other digital technologies."
