The OCD Contact Person for your parish, school, or organization should have received an email notification from The Official Catholic Directory on or around November 9 for reviewing/updating your entity in the directory. It is imperative that all parishes, schools, and organizations update the information and submit by the **deadline, Wednesday, December 7**. After the deadline, the portal will be closed. BEACONS OF LIGHT FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES

To help you prepare for any upcoming possible parish staff changes, as well as the possible merging of one or more parishes within a Family of Parishes, the Department of Human Resources is available to assist in providing human resources oversight, guidance, and support during the pastoral planning process.

One of the Parameters of the pastoral planning process states: "Every Family of Parishes must work with the Pastoral Center Department of Human Resources to review staffing models." To that end, we ask that parishes begin gathering and organizing HR data for each parish location to be used in creating staffing models for Families of Parishes.

Beginning July 1, 2022, we partnered with Strategic HR, an HR consulting firm, to assist us in gathering and organizing HR data from parishes. While each Family is unique and will require different levels of assistance, the data we gather will help us to provide whatever HR assistance might be needed as it relates to staffing your Family of Parishes. Specifically, we can help with providing staffing models, interviewing/hiring, performance management, employment law compliance, separation of employment and HR best practices for your Family. General information needed:

- Provide a job description for each staff member.
- Provide an Organization Chart of the existing parish structure.
- Parish RIF/Reorganization policy if there is one.
- Any performance and/or discipline documentation in current employee files going back 3-5 years (performance reviews, corrective counseling, etc.).

OHIO MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE

Ohio's minimum wage will be \$10.10 beginning **January 1, 2023**, which will be the largest increase to the state minimum wage since voters approved a formula that adjusts the hourly wage based on inflation. The state constitution requires Ohio to raise the minimum wage each year based on the rate of inflation from a 12-month span. The Consumer Price Index from September 2021 through August 2022 was 8.7%. This means the state's current minimum wage of \$9.30 will jump to \$10.10 an hour. JOIN ARCHBISHOP SCHNURR IN A STUDY OF THE MASS

To help further encourage Eucharistic understanding and devotion among the faithful as part of the National Eucharistic Revival (which will culminate with a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis in July 2024), Archbishop Schnurr has announced an archdiocese-wide study of the wonder of the Mass during the six weeks of Ordinary Time between Christmas and Lent. The content of the study will be the excellent video series **The Mass**, available in both English and Spanish, from Bishop Robert Barron's Word on Fire Ministries.

People can sign up for free at catholicaoc.org/theMass. Each Sunday from January 8 to February 12, Archbishop Schnurr will email participants the 25-minute episode along with his own brief insights. Participants can view the study at their own pace, on their own time, over the course of the week to invigorate their love for Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.

Archbishop Schnurr asks that you “vigorously promote the study to your parishioners throughout December to take advantage of the ‘invitation opportunity’ afforded by increased Mass attendance during the Advent and Christmas seasons.” To that end:

PRIESTS' SABBATICALS

The two year-long Covid crisis caused an interruption in the regular flow of applications for priests' sabbaticals. As you may know, full three-month sabbaticals are normally limited to four priests per year. However, one-month sabbaticals are also a possibility (some priests have taken two or three of these over a three-year period instead of one three-month sabbatical). With the two-year interruption, there are many priests who have expressed interest in a sabbatical in the near future. Unfortunately, we will not be able to accommodate every priest as soon as he might wish. In the new year, the Priestly Formation Office will be sending out sabbatical interest forms to priests who have expressed interest in a sabbatical on their Priests' Personnel annual update form.

RITE OF ELECTION (AND CALL TO CONTINUING CONVERSION) 2023

The Rite of Election (and Call to Continuing Conversion) will be celebrated as usual on the First Sunday of Lent, February 26, 2023. This important Lenten ritual is for catechumens preparing for full initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and First Communion) at the Easter Vigil 2022. Also invited are those baptized Christians who are seeking to be received into the full communion of the Catholic Church this Easter and have been preparing alongside the catechumens. (Please remember that non-Catholic Christians may be received into full communion any time during the year.) Like last year, parishes may choose from any of the liturgies for their group to attend, based on geography, timing, or language; there will be no deanery-specific assignments. The Arrupe and Loyola buildings accommodate large overnight retreats with a capacity of up to 56 guests. The Thomas House is for smaller retreat groups of up to 8 guests and the Schott Pavilion, which is used for day retreats, can hold up to 100 guests. There is also a cabin for an individual seeking a private hermitage atmosphere.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAMS



JSC offers two internship programs: one for Spiritual Directors and one in Youth Ministry. The Spiritual Direction Internship program trains adults to be spiritual directors rooted in the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola. The youth ministry internship is a post-graduate, community living program for young adults seeking experience in youth retreat
