#### Parish Vitality Report

A snapshot into the movement toward greater parish vitality in the 57 Families of Parishes at the mid-point of the first year of Beacons.

#### Based on:

- notes from Center for Parish Vitality staff
- observations of deans and Pastoral Center staff
- reporting from the pastors themselves in fall Deanery Mtgs
- Oct Count data (from the last decade including 2022)
- adoption curve placement,
- general observations from Beacons Liaisons
- financials (2020 and 2021)
- anecdotes and "anecdata".



**Summary Observations** 

The majority of our 57 Families are where we would expect or ahead of schedule. Only a handful of Families are seriously behind in the process, and the issues are clear. The remaining Families are more or less on track, perhaps with some significant challenges to overcome. For a change management process such as Beacons of Light, these are favorable results at the six-month mark and are within expectations. We are working to support all pastors specific to their progress and needs.

Qualitative measures of pastoral planning progress indicate that the faithful are open to this change process and also provide evidence that many Families of Parishes have had early successes along the path to greater vitality and canonical unification.

There are reasons for hope, based on objective measures of vitality (such as Mass attendance and financial giving). There are also reasons for concern consistent with the overall need for Beacons of Light. Mass attendance, although up from last year, has not recovered from COVID-19. Many pastors are stretched thin as they accommodate new assignments and the ramp-up of Beacons of Light.

Where Families of Parishes have taken advantage of the resources (digital, liaison, in-person events, etc.) provided for their assistance, success has come a bit more quickly.



#### The Problem

Everyone says they don't like meetings, but we need to come together to communicate, make decisions, and stay aligned.



Tip 1: Set the right duration and format for different meetings

#### Tip 2: Have a structured format for your Weekly Meetings

- Standard Agenda (sample to be provided) including:
  - Prayer and Value Review
  - Agenda Review
  - Topics
  - Close with Plus/Delta and Prayer
- Established Roles
  - Leader
  - Participants
  - Recorder

#### Tip 3: Keep the meeting focused and forward-looking

- Require prework if necessary. Presume compliance.
- Start and end meetings on time.
- Determine if time-consuming items need to be discussed at a future ad hoc meeting.
- Spend the most time on topics of greatest impact
- Document new issues that are raised by placing them in a "parking lot" to be discussed more fully at a later date.
- Document decisions made, responsibilities accepted and due dates.
- Do a process review of the meeting: Plus Delta

### Phase 2 Update

- Close to final development with plan to roll out in March or April
- Key components with some variation by Principle
  - Follow up/Reinforce from Phase 1
  - Visio Day and Parish Visioning
  - Formation of teams associated with each principle
  - Prayer and discernment **opportunities** for parishioners

#### VISION Create a vision for a Eucharist-(🌼 ) EUCHARIST centered parish, form a Family Worship Commission and Family Worship Dept of staff. Increase Family prayer and ( CHURCH discernment opportunities focused on a shared future **LEADERSHIP** Leaders discern and create the vision for the Family. Offer opportunities for stewardship (🐕) STEWARDSHIP formation for parish leaders and create a Family vision statement for stewardship. Form an Evangelization Team; establish personal and **EVANGELIZATION** team prayer and formation commitments and practice healthy teamwork. Solidify leadership for the Love in **LOVE IN ACTION** Action Parish Family Core Team and create a local vision.
