Our Kettering Catholic Community...Celebrating One Year Together

July 1, 2023 was our first anniversary of the implementation of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati's Beacons of Light initiative, bringing St. Albert, St. Charles and Ascension together as a Family of Parishes. The vision of the plan designed by Archbishop Schnurr and the Beacons teams is for all families of parishes to be "one canonical parish" in five years. This is an ambitious endeavor and reflects the shortage of priests, the decline in Mass attendance, the best use of our physical and human resources, and to celebrate liturgies and sacraments in a reverent and vibrant manner.


Let's look at what this means and where we've been so far:

- "One canonical parish" means to become one parish with one pastor, one set of finances and one set of sacramental and ministerial processes. It does not necessarily mean one church facility.
 It is most likely that our one parish will have three sites. We may see other families of parishes close locations, but this is not in our future at this time, if ever.
- Since July 2022 we have celebrated more than 1400 Masses between our three locations.
 These include weekend and daily Masses, funerals, weddings, holy days, civic holidays and other special events.
- Events shared by all three parishes have been great celebrations! A combined Easter Vigil,
 4th of July and other Masses for civic holidays, formation sessions for children and adults, as well as social events, have been quite successful. Masses and events such as these are our future.
 We encourage you to participate in our joint ventures.
- I want to be the first (and trust you will join me) in thanking our priests (Fr. Tom, Fr. Chibueze, Fr. Dan and other visiting priests) for their service during a transition year that has been both challenging and rewarding. While recognizing the changes this past year have not been easy for parishioners, it has been a challenge for the priests as well.
- Our staff and deacons have come to know each other and have worked well together on the Beacons' journey. The KCC is blessed with talented, faith-filled and dedicated individuals. Be sure to thank them!
- Keep your prayers coming. Father Tom, Father Chibueze and I have felt the power of your prayers as we move along in this Beacons of Light transition. Truly the Holy Spirit is leading us in the right direction as we work to not be merely "friendly neighbors," but "family."
- Keep an open mind; change is a difficult but necessary part of life. We are all in this together.
 Remember that Jesus challenged His disciples to accept new ways of being who they were called to be as Church. We are now being called to do the same.
- Finally, I want to thank the parishioners of our three parishes. Change is difficult, and we certainly have seen many changes over the last year. After a few months of adapting to our new reality, Fr. Tom, Fr. Chibueze, the staff and I have appreciated your support (vocal, written and prayerful) and involvement in the liturgies and activities within the KCC family. It has been a privilege to walk this journey with you.

Let's continue on our journey with God and one another. Peace, Father Ed


