





Chris and his team have formed "centers of excellence" for specific areas of formation, to include a close collaboration with the parish school for children's formation, and revamped meeting spaces for teens more conducive to deeper faith conversations. These centers allow us to roughly double the capacity of children and youth being served, as well as support the goal of raising up young leaders "and letting them run!"

Under construction is a graphic representation of the discipleship pathway, initially targeting adults at various stages of their faith journey. Soon we will map all of our adult faith formation offerings onto this pathway, in order to identify and close gaps.



Being faithful to a year-round "Becoming Catholic" apostolate, the Holy Spirit brings an average of 6-10 new inquirers to our doorstep every few months. And we've expanded and enhanced our sacrament preparation for children and youth in this growing parish family through a strategic investment in part-time staff.

Our family of parishes, with our shared school, represents over \$6 million in annual activity, with 15 buildings on well over 50 acres of land. That's a valuable patrimony and we have some significant catching up to do in caring for it. And, as the founding generation of our parishes understood, the task of sharing our Catholic Faith relies on providing a place of welcome and worship; that's why they passed on these facilities to us, and now it is our task to do the same to the next generation.
