OHIO MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE

Ohio's minimum wage is scheduled to increase to \$11.00 beginning January 1, 2026. The state constitution requires Ohio to raise the minimum wage each year based on the rate of inflation from a 12-month span. The state minimum wage is tied to the Consumer Price Index (CPI-W) for urban wage earners and clerical workers over the 12-month period prior to September. The CPI-W index increased by 3% over the 12-month period from September 1, 2024, to September 30, 2025. This means the state's current minimum wage of \$10.70 will jump to \$11.00 an hour.

NEW IMAGE LIBRARY AVAILABLE FOR PARISH COMMUNICATORS

Over the past few months, the archdiocese Communications Office has built out a Digital Asset Management (DAM) system to house photos and other images using a platform called Canto. Canto serves as a central repository for what is currently over 9,000 photos, graphics, and other visual resources. Access to this platform, which is free of charge, will enable Families of Parishes to easily search, download, and use this content in their own communications.

YOUTH RELIGIOUS EDUCATION POLICY FOR PARISHES UPDATE

Archbishop Casey approved a change to the "Youth Religious Education Policy for Parishes" whereby students in parish religious education programs across the archdiocese are no longer required to take the annual Assessment of Religious Knowledge (ARK). ARK is now optional for students. ARK remains required for all volunteer catechists and ministry staff.

2025 CMA UPDATE - \$7 MILLION IN PLEDGES

Congratulations and thank you! Pledges to the 2025 Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA) have now exceeded \$7 million! As of November 20, just over \$7.02 million has been pledged to the appeal from 19,721 households. Of the amount pledged, \$6.82 million has been received in pledge contributions.

So far, 89 parishes have exceeded their CMA goal in contributions – which means a total of over \$700,000 will stay at these parishes for their own local needs (50% of over-goal contributions stay at the parish).
