OHIO MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE

Ohio's minimum wage increased to \$11.00 beginning January 1, 2026. The state constitution requires Ohio to raise the minimum wage each year based on the rate of inflation over a 12-month span. The state minimum wage is tied to the Consumer Price Index (CPI-W) for urban wage earners and clerical workers over the 12-month period prior to September. The CPI-W index increased by 3% over the 12-month period from September 1, 2024, to September 30, 2025. This means the state's current minimum wage of \$10.70 will jump to \$11.00 an hour.

LENTEN REMINDERS – FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday, February 18 and Good Friday, April 3 are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast, that is, limited to a single full meal. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of **abstinence** binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of **fasting** binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (canons 97, 1252).

"Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection may be attained with uplifted and clear mind." (Constitution on the Liturgy, No. 110)
