



Back Together Sunday Letter Campaign

Preparing for Your Outreach

Before beginning your outreach, the clergy, staff, and leadership team at your parish should prayerfully discern the following:

Who will receive these invitations?

Identify parishioners you haven't seen in a while, those who attend infrequently, or those who were once active members of your parish community. As you create your list, begin praying for each person by name.

Consider how each person would most meaningfully receive an invitation. For some, a personal phone call or conversation may be best. For others, a handwritten letter or card may communicate the care and welcome you want to extend.

The goal is not simply to increase attendance, but to remind people that they are known, valued, and always welcome in their parish home.

Who will pray for this effort?

Invite a team of parishioners to serve as prayer intercessors for this initiative. Ask them to pray for those who will receive invitations, those who will extend invitations, and all who may be searching for a deeper connection with Christ and the Church.

Prayer is at the heart of this effort. We trust that God is already working in the hearts of those we hope to welcome back.

Sending Invitations

One of the most meaningful ways to reconnect with those who have become disconnected from the parish is through a direct, personal invitation.

A letter communicates something important: you matter, **you are remembered, and there is a place for you here.**

Below you will find sample invitation letters that can be adapted for your parish community. Customize the message to reflect your parish's personality and include your own details for Back Together Sunday.

Copy the letter onto parish letterhead and personalize the information before sending. While email invitations can be effective, a physical letter often communicates a deeper level of care and personal connection.

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Sample Invitation Letter from Pastor or Parish Staff

Sample Invitation Letter from Pastor or School Principal
