Looking for a program to enhance school climate and engage kids in creating a safe space for all? Check out the Anti-Defamation League's (ADL), **No Place for Hate** program. It animates students to design activities to promote mutual respect not despite of but BECAUSE of and IN CELEBRATION of differences (diversity). There is a wealth of supporting resources available for classroom use across grade levels. For an orientation, check out the 45-minute video. If you're looking for a way to get the sage off the stage and allow kids to lead the way, here's a program with a lot of potential. ADL employs regional coordinators across the country to serve as your guide on the side. Our region's headquarters is in Cleveland and serves schools in several states. Joe Nagle is just beginning to explore this program for Sacred Heart School.

Howard, Tyrone: Why Race and Culture Matter: Closing the Achievement Gap, ©2020. Issues tied to race and culture continue to be a part of the landscape of America's schools and classrooms. Given the rapid demographic transformation in the nation's states, cities, counties, and schools, it is essential that *all school personnel* acquire the necessary knowledge, skills, and dispositions to talk, teach, and think across racial and cultural differences. The second edition of Howard's bestseller has been updated to take a deeper look at how schools must be prepared to respond to disparate outcomes among students of color. Tyrone Howard draws on theoretical constructs tied to race and racism, culture, and opportunity gaps to address pressing issues stemming from the chronic inequalities that remain prevalent in many schools across the country. This time-honored text will help educators at all levels respond with greater conviction and clarity on how to create more equitable, inclusive, and democratic schools as sites for teaching and learning. Recently graduated from Harvard University, Michelle Kuo arrived in the rural town of Helena, Arkansas, as a Teach for America volunteer, bursting with optimism and drive. But she soon encountered the jarring realities of life in one of the poorest counties in America, still disabled by the legacy of slavery and Jim Crow. In this stirring memoir, Kuo, the child of Taiwanese immigrants, shares the story of her complicated but rewarding mentorship of one student, Patrick Browning, and his remarkable literary and personal awakening.
