PRISON MINISTRY SEEKING VOLUNTEERS

The Archdiocese Prison Ministry is actively recruiting volunteers for a new program at Warren Correctional and Dayton Correctional institutions starting in August. Bridges To Life, a 14 week faith-based restorative justice course aimed at healing the incarcerated and the victims of crime, has a 22 year track record of reducing recidivism among its participants to less than half of the national average. We welcome anyone of good will, including victims of crime and ex-offenders, who can show up consistently and are willing to facilitate discussions. Space is limited to a team of 12. "RADIATE CHRIST" PASTORAL LETTER

As you recall, next summer we will celebrate the two centuries of faith since our archdiocese was established on June 19, 1821. In anticipation of the bicentennial, Archbishop Schnurr has written a pastoral letter, entitled "Radiate Christ," urging each of us to discipleship and to "rediscover the joy of knowing Christ deeply and following Him, thereby becoming a witness to the world." It is Archbishop Schnurr's hope that all Catholics of the archdiocese will prayerfully read this letter and engage with its contents, reflecting upon our relationship with the Lord and considering how we can individually and collectively *Radiate Christ* to all whom we encounter. Please encourage your staff and parishioners to do so. Various offices of the archdiocesan Pastoral Center are collaborating on a discussion guide to help with this; look for this in the coming weeks.

2020 MELCHISEDECH OPEN CANCELLED

The 2020 Melchisedech Open has been cancelled. MONTHLY BILLINGS BEGIN IN JULY

Beginning in July 2020, the parish general assessment and parish property and liability billings for fiscal year 2020-21 will be sent monthly. The initial billings will be estimated until all parish financial reports are reviewed and the annual calculations are completed. Once the calculations are complete, the remaining billing statements will be adjusted to reflect the actual cost. This should help parishes by spreading these expenses over twelve months. The due date for paying the second half of the 2019-20 parish general assessment remains at September 30, 2020. Please plan accordingly.

FLEXIBILITY IN REQUIREMENTS RELATED TO FORM 1-9 COMPLIANCE

The Department of Homeland Security has temporarily relaxed the requirements around physically viewing work authorization documents for purposes of completing the Form I-9 during the COVID-19 pandemic. You can find more information around this temporary change on the Human Resources webpage.

WORKING STUDENT GUIDELINES

This document is intended to provide school administrators and pastors information about employment of students **during** and **after** school and **through** the summer months. Students under the age of 18 are considered minors and may not work at anything that is hazardous or injurious to their health and well-being, including: activities involving flammable substances, gases, vapors or fumes; activities involving driving a school bus, motor van or any motor-propelled vehicle. MISSIONARY CO-OPERATION PLAN (MCP) PANDEMIC RECOMMENDATIONS

Below are some MCP recommendations from the Mission Office in light of the pandemic:

- a) The Mission Office suggests that pastors continue to set up tentative dates with their assigned MCP missionary organization to speak and take up donations at their parishes.
- b) If the virus outbreak continues, pastors could postpone the missioner's visit/appeal to some other weekend until the end of December.
- c) If another date cannot be arranged, the missionary organization may have a local representative who could speak on their behalf. A few local retired priests have even offered to speak on these missioners' behalf.
- d) Possibly the local pastor would also be open to a short video or a brief spoken appeal from the missionary group to be shown or read at weekend masses.
- e) Another possibility would be a bulletin announcement explaining the work of the MCP group and where an on-line video could be viewed about that missionary organization.

Some MCP representatives have not yet mailed their required "Letter of Suitability" to the Mission Office. Until that is completed, the office is not permitted to share that MCP group's contact information with local pastors.

As the pandemic strikes into struggling mission territories around the world, the need to share with these fellow Catholics this year is even more vital. God bless you for your global mission solidarity.


