• CRS Collection

The entire second collection from May 4 - 5 should be **turned in by Monday, June 17**. Please submit your collection to the Archdiocesan Finance Office, 100 E. Eighth St., Cincinnati, Ohio 45202. Write "CRS Collection" on the memo line.

• CRS Rice Bowl

If your parish participated in Rice Bowl, collect all funds from participating parishioners and send one check to the Archdiocese by **Monday**, **June 17**. Write "CRS Rice Bowl" on the memo line, and mail to: Archdiocesan Finance Office, 100 E. Eighth St., Cincinnati, Ohio 45202.

FOCCUS PRE-MARITAL INVENTORY

Beginning on July 1, 2019, the Archdiocesan Office for Marriage & Family Life will no longer manage or score the FOCCUS Inventory for parishes. Parishes using the FOCCUS instrument should set up their own account directly through FOCCUS prior to July 1, 2019. FOCCUS has streamlined the process for setting up and managing your own FOCCUS account so that it is actually much simpler than working through the Archdiocese. While FOCCUS encourages all parishes to utilize their online inventory, they will also score paper inventories for those who prefer that option. This document is intended to provide school administrators and pastors information about employment of students **during** and **after** school and **through** the summer months. Students under the age of 18 are considered minors and may not work at anything that is hazardous or potentially injurious to their health and well-being including: activities involving flammable substances, gases, vapors or fumes; activities involving driving a school bus, motor van or any motor-propelled vehicle. <u>Click</u> for full document.
