CLARIFICATION ON POLICY FOR EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION UNDER 21

In light of the new policy regarding the ministry of EMsHC under the age of 21 no longer consuming excess Precious Blood, the Office for Divine Worship and Sacraments (ODWS) wishes to re-affirm that the norm in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati is that Holy Communion be offered under both species (per *This Holy and Living Sacrifice*, pp. 4-5), especially on Sunday, but also "at other celebrations of the Eucharist when it can be done with reverence and dignity."

If you would like any practical assistance in implementing this new policy regarding ministry by minors while maintaining Communion under both forms, please don't hesitate to contact the ODWS at 513.421.3131x2670. We do plan to reach out to Catholic high schools, in preparation for the new school year, to offer assistance with preparing school liturgies this fall.

CONCEALED CARRY POLICY (UPDATED JULY 1, 2019)

Changes to the Archdiocesan concealed carry policy, which supersede all previous policies:

Regarding Church Buildings: The law provides that a concealed handgun may not be carried into any church or other place of worship unless the church or place of worship permits it. Archbishop Schnurr has determined that whether or not a firearm or weapon of any kind is permitted in any church building is left to the discretion of the pastor of the church. This authorization from the pastor must be a written authorization and given only to an individual with a CCW Permit and only to meet a security need.

Regarding Office Buildings: The law provides that an employer may prohibit the presence of firearms on the premises. Archbishop Schnurr has determined that whether or not a firearm or weapon of any kind is permitted in any parish or institution office building is left to the discretion of the pastor or the chief executive officer of the institution. This authorization from the pastor or chief executive officer must be a written authorization and given only to an individual with a CCW Permit and only to meet a security need.

Regarding School Buildings: The law provides that a concealed handgun may not be carried in a "school safety zone." A school safety zone consists of a school, school building, school premises, school activity, school bus; and everything up to the property boundary. School activity includes any activity held under the auspices of a school. Unless authorized by law, no person shall knowingly possess, have under the person's control, convey, or attempt to convey a firearm, deadly weapon, or dangerous ordinance into a school safety zone. Archbishop Schnurr has determined that, except as noted below, no persons are permitted to bring a firearm, deadly weapon, or dangerous ordinance into a school safety zone. This policy shall not prohibit the following persons from carrying a firearm in a school safety zone provided the person possesses valid photographic identification: (1) law enforcement officers; and (2) security personnel employed by or contracted with the Archdiocese and who have been granted written permission by a management official of the Archdiocese to carry a firearm while on duty.
