TRIBUNAL OFFICE

TRIBUNAL CHANGES

In response to the *motu priorio* from Pope Francis, *Mitis Iudex* announced 8 September 2015 which will take effect 8 December 2015, Archbishop Schnurr announced the Archdiocese will no longer charge fees for marriage cases after 14 September 2015. However, there remain a few fees charged by Rome for cases which need to be sent there: Favor of the Faith \$475, a non-consummated marriage \$900, and an appeal to the Roman Rota \$850. Those fees remain in effect until Rome may waive them.

In the coming year, there will be a revision of the TRIBUNAL HANDBOOK. Until that is published, please use the current forms without the fee sheets. If you have suggestions for revision of the current forms in the HANDBOOK, please email them to victoriav@catholiccincinnati.org or send them by regular mail to Sister Victoria at the Tribunal.

There will be a new process for a few rare cases which could be decided before the Archbishop. Access to that process will be determined by the Tribunal. Please submit formal cases as usual. Should one of those cases qualify for the new procedure, the Tribunal will contact you about how to proceed.

OFFICE OF SAFE ENVIRONMENT FOR THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN AND YOUTH

BACKGROUND CHECK / CHILD PROTECTION TRAINING

All "employees" and "regular volunteers" as defined in the July 1, 2013 *Decree on Child Protection (Decree*) must receive an acceptable background check, and must attend a VIRTUS ® Child Awareness Session on the *Decree* before they can have contact with children. If any employee or regular volunteer has not received an acceptable background check result and / or not attended a VIRTUS ® Child Awareness Session on the *Decree*, that employee or regular volunteer is not approved to have contact with children and may not have contact with children. In addition, all new employees within the Archdiocese of Cincinnati must complete and sign a B.4 Form and send them to the Office of Safe Environment for Protection of Children and Youth before the new employee can begin having contact with children.

DECREE POLICY REMINDER

A.7 Policy – Clerics, employees and regular volunteers should learn as much as they can about the causes, forms and symptoms of child abuse through reading, participation in workshops, reading all monthly VIRTUS® bulletins as continuing education requirements, and staff discussions. Reminder: To be in compliance an individual must be 2 or less behind on their monthly training bulletins.

OLD VIRTUS® ACCOUNTS

To assist the Local Safe Environment Coordinator (SEC) with maintaining their Master report we will be identifying individuals who registered for a VIRTUS® account and have not completed monthly bulletins on a regular basis. To assist us on this endeavor please review your records to ensure all your employees and volunteers are current on their bulletins. Please identify individuals who are not active at your location and remove them from you master report.

- If you are the only location listed, and need to inactivate the person for some reason, in the "Notes" section at the bottom of the page, write a short note as to why they are inactivated, your initials / name, and date. This will give everyone a 'paper trail' of information in the future.
- If you are one of many locations, and the person is no longer active at your location, simply remove your location from their VIRTUS account. Keep in mind that once you remove your location from their VIRTUS account, you will NOT be able to make any other changes or notes. Make all notations in the "Notes" section at the bottom of the page PRIOR to deleting your location from their VIRTUS account.

Starting in January 2016, we will inactivate any individual who have 30 or more unread bulletins.

FINANCE AND ACCOUNTING OFFICE

ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT - PARISHSOFT

All parishes and consolidated schools are required to submit an Annual Financial Report each year to the Finance Office. To those locations that have provided their report, we thank you for your cooperation. If your location has not filed the Annual Financial Report, please provide a copy of the following reports from the ParishSoft program for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2015 as soon as possible:

1) Statement of Activities – Columnar by Entity

3) ParishSoft cover page (available on website under Finance Office Documents)

You must close the fiscal year June 30, 2015 before you submit reports to your pastor, finance council, parish and Archdiocese. The assessments will only be calculated using the "closed" fiscal year.

The Finance Office will utilize the Statement of Activities – Columnar by Entity report to calculate the General Assessment bill. Please note that it is the responsibility of the parishes and consolidated schools to submit complete and balanced reports. The Finance Office may return any report that is out-of-balance or incomplete.

The Financial Report must be examined by either the Finance Committee of the Parish Council or by a Certified Public Accounting Firm. In addition to submitting a Financial Report to the Finance Office, the pastor must publish a Financial Report to the members of the parish, including a separate report of the elementary school operations each year. The report to the parishioners should contain the budget for the year reported, the actual experience, and the budget for the coming year.

DESIGNATED COLLECTIONS

Parishes should send the monies collected for Archdiocesan Designated Collections shortly after the collection date to the Finance Office, with the exception of the Mission Sunday collection which should go to the Mission Office. These funds are not the property of the parish and should not be used for operating expenses. Thanks for your cooperation. FLEXIBLE SPENDING ACCOUNTS (FSA) AND DEPENDENT CARE (DC) BENEFIT TIMELINE

It is very important that the annual employee election for the 2015-2016 fiscal year is entered into the Paycor system accurately. The total election should be divided by the number of pay periods for the fiscal year. The monthly FSA and DC deductions are drafted from the parish or school account on the last business day of each month. Please be sure to reconcile the employee deductions and the amounts drafted by the Finance Office each month. Please be sure to check your payroll deduction amounts for the Plan year for employees who have either terminated their participation or newly elected to participate in the Plan. NEW RATE ON INVESTMENT NOTES

From the Desk of the Senior Auditor

This month our findings relate to 401(k) Plan contributions and supporting documents needed before payments are made.

Finding: 401(k) Plan employee withholdings and/or employer contributions are not sent to the third-party record keeper on a timely basis.

In reviewing the 401(k) data at parishes and schools, we have noted that employer and/or employee contributions have sometimes not been processed. It is important to keep tight control in this area which is regulated by the IRS. Procedures should be established to ensure timely processing of 401(k) employer contributions and employee deferrals following payroll processing. The 401(k) data per the Fifth Third system must be reconciled to the general ledger accounts monthly. We recommend after each payroll is prepared, reconciliation and preparation of the 401(k) monies must be approved and submitted for withdrawal through Fifth Third Direct, the 401(k) record keeper.

Finding: Ineligible employees are included in the 401(k) Plan and eligible employees are not included in the 401(k) Plan. All employees regularly working 20 hours or more per week are eligible and should be included in the 401(k) benefit plan.

We have found employees who are eligible for the 401(k) benefit not properly enrolled as well as employees who are not eligible either making contributions through payroll withholdings or having employer contributions made on their behalf. Individuals processed through the Paycor system are provided the benefits prescribed by law, such as FICA, Worker's Compensation, Unemployment Compensation, and the like. All employees working 20 hours or more per week have the opportunity to contribute to the 401(k) retirement plan and to have employer contributions made on their behalf. Failure to properly process individuals through payroll violates IRS tax laws. The Archdiocesan 401(k) Plan is in jeopardy if locations do not follow the Department of Labor and IRS rules and regulations.

Finding: Supporting documents for payments to vendors, employees or volunteers are not on file or approved.

All payments are to have supporting documentation in the form of a vendor invoice or a check request. We recommend that locations have an invoice approval policy which dictates which staff member should approve certain invoices or check requests. This signature approval will document that someone has inspected and recounted merchandise purchased and that someone with authority has OK'd the invoice or check request for payment. We recommend that the pastor approve with his initials the supporting documentation for all staff reimbursements, all credit card bills with receipts attached, and all nonrecurring invoices over a certain dollar amount.

Equipment or repairs over \$5,000 (except in case of emergency) are to be recommended to the pastor in the Pastoral Council minutes. The Parish must submit all known or anticipated expenditures greater than \$25,000 to the Archdiocesan Director of Financial Services. This review assures the Archbishop that the parish has the necessary funds for the project, has obtained competitive bids and has entered into a fair contract with the vendor/contractor.

EMPLOYMENT VERIFICATION

Please advise your employees that in the event they are required to have an employment verification done for any reason, they should be sure the institution requesting the information has the name of their primary employer, i.e., parish or school. When the Archdiocese of Cincinnati is listed as the employer, the Human Resources Department receives the call and we are unable to verify employment for anyone other than our Central Office employees.

REPORTING FINANCIAL MISCONDUCT - In a spirit of good stewardship, the Archdiocese of Cincinnati has instituted a financial misconduct hotline to allow employees, volunteers, vendors and other interested parties to report what they believe to be financial misconduct at any level – parish, deanery or Archdiocese. As an additional safeguard, the hotline is administered by an independent third-party company, EthicsPoint.
