OFFICE OF THE ARCHBISHOP

Recently I received correspondence from Lorenzo Cardinal Baldisseri, the Secretary General of the Synod of Bishops regarding the upcoming XIV Ordinary General Assembly.

The III Extraordinary General Assembly which took place last October focused on *The Pastoral Challenges of the Family in the Context of Evangelization*. The final document of this extraordinary synodal assembly, the *Relatio Synodi*, is the preparatory document or *Lineamenta* of the XIV Ordinary General Assembly, scheduled to take place in the Vatican from October 4 – 15, 2015, to consider the topic: *The Vocation and Mission of the Family in the Church and Contemporary World*. In this way, the two synodal assemblies share the same topic of the family and become part of a single synodal process. The intervening time between synods is an opportunity to reflect on the reaction of the first synod and to make a thorough theological examination of the Church's pastoral activity.

The process of preparing for the Ordinary Synod begins with a consultation in each of the world's dioceses. Our Archdiocese of Cincinnati Pastoral Council will be discussing the *Lineamenta* at its next meeting on March 7. Additionally, all the faithful of the Archdiocese will have the opportunity to participate as well. LENTEN REMINDERS – FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday, February 18, 2015, and Good Friday, April 3, 2015, are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast, that is, limited to a single full meal. The other Fridays of the season of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (canons 97 and 1252). With regard to Good Friday, the teaching of the Second Vatican Council should be recalled.

Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection may be attained with uplifted and clear mind (*Constitution on the Liturgy, No. 110*).

With regard to the obligatory days listed above, however, there are frequent questions about the degree of seriousness of the matter. The teaching of Pope John Paul II may be simply paraphrased: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe an individual day of penance is not considered serious. People should seek to do more rather than less. Fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimum response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion.

CONFIRMATION AND THE FACULTY TO CONFIRM

The following might be helpful for you regarding Confirmation at the Easter Vigil. For priests who have been granted the faculties of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, these are the instructions for the Faculty to Confirm as found in the *Pagella*, Clerus Cincinnatensis, Volume XII, No. 1, pages 260-261. The mandate is given to all priests in the Archdiocese:

- 1. **to baptize and confirm** in accordance with canon 883.2 persons who are no longer infants whom the priest judges suitable for Catholic baptism;
- 2. **to admit into full communion** with the Catholic Church **and to confirm** in accordance with canon 883.2 previously baptized persons who are no longer infants whom the priest judges suitable for admission to the Catholic Church;
- 3. **to readmit into full communion** with the Catholic Church and **to confirm** in accordance with the response to the Pontifical Commission for the Interpretation of the Decrees of the Second Vatican Council, April 25, 1975, persons beyond infancy who were baptized Catholic but not confirmed and who later became an apostate or a heretic, whom the priest judges suitable for readmission to the Catholic Church. (If you have any questions about whether or not someone later became an apostate or a heretic, please call the Chancery.)
- 4. Priests do not have the faculty to confirm a baptized but never confirmed Catholic who simply has not been active in the practice of the faith without becoming a member of another Church and now desires to be confirmed and be actively involved in the Church's life. In these cases, individual delegation of the archbishop is needed. Priests can seek such delegation in writing from the Chancery, giving reasons why the delegation is sought, the name of the person to be delegated, the name of the candidate, and the intended date of the ceremony.

If you need to request a faculty to confirm, please do so in ample time to receive it before the Easter Vigil. Also, if you have more than one parish, please include the name of the parish where the Confirmation will take place. Thank you.

WORKSHOP ON THE DIACONATE WITH FR. SHAWN MCKNIGHT

We are pleased to announce that Fr. Shawn McKnight will be coming to the Athenaeum on Saturday, February 14, for a workshop on the diaconate. The title of the workshop will be: "Betwixt and Between: The Deacon as Symbol of *Communitas* and Social Intermediary among the People of God." Fr. McKnight has served at the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops as the Executive Director of the Secretariat of Clergy, Consecrated Life and Vocations since June 2010. He earned the License and Doctorate in Sacred Theology from the Pontifical Athenaeum of St. Anselm in Rome, specializing in sacramental theology and writing on the permanent diaconate. OFFICE OF SAFE ENVIRONMENT FOR THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN AND YOUTH

BACKGROUND CHECK / CHILD PROTECTION TRAINING

All "employees" and "regular volunteers" as defined in the July 1, 2013 *Decree on Child Protection (Decree*) must receive an acceptable background check and must attend a VIRTUS ® Child Awareness Session on the *Decree* before they can have contact with children. If any employee or regular volunteer has not received an acceptable background check result and / or not attended a VIRTUS ® Child Awareness Session on the *Decree*, that employee or regular volunteer is not approved to have contact with children and may not have contact with children. In addition, all new employees within the Archdiocese of Cincinnati must complete and sign a B.4 Form and send them to the Office of Safe Environment for the Protection of Children and Youth before the new employee can begin having contact with children.

CHANGE TO EMPLOYEE MANUAL FINGERPRINTING AND ELECTRONIC BACKGROUND CHECKS

Background

As a result of the 2011 USCCB audit, a background check through the use of manual fingerprinting was required every 5 years. In January 2014, the Archdiocese contracted with SELECTION.COM® to complete all manual fingerprinting and electronic background checks. Additionally, all employees are required to complete an electronic background check through SELECTION.COM® by December 31, 2018. In October 2014, the Archdiocese received an onsite audit. The Office of Child and Youth Protection at the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the USCCB external auditors, and external legal counsel were consulted regarding the requirement for ongoing background checks and our use of the quarterly

checks through SELECTION.COM®. Our proposal was new employees at offices, parishes, schools, agencies or institutions of the Archdiocese must complete both manual fingerprinting and an electronic background check at time of employment with no further requirement for manual fingerprinting in the future. Additionally, all employees will receive quarterly electronic background checks. The consensus was that this is a new gold standard for other Dioceses to use.

CHANGE TO CURRENT POLICY

All new employees must complete both manual fingerprinting and an electronic background check at time of employment with no further requirement for manual fingerprinting in the future. Current employees are required to complete an electronic background check through SELECTION.COM® within 5 years of their last manual fingerprinting or December 31, 2018, whichever is sooner. This will only affect individuals being manually fingerprinted for compliance with the *Decree*. This does not apply to individuals that require fingerprinting for regulatory compliance (teachers, high school coaches, etc.). This policy becomes effective March 1, 2015.

FINANCE AND ACCOUNTING OFFICE

"YELLOW PAGES" ALERT

Once again, please be aware of email or phone solicitations requesting you to sign up for advertising in the "Yellow Pages." Please make all of your employees aware that they should not agree to any solicitation by email or phone from the "Yellow Pages." One of their methods is to tape record the phone conversation and try to elicit some agreement to their terms. Our attorneys and the Attorney General of the State of Ohio have both been working on this scam. DESIGNATED COLLECTIONS

Parishes should send the monies collected for Archdiocesan Designated Collections shortly after the collection date to the Finance Office, with the exception of the Mission Sunday collection which should go to the Mission Office. These funds are not the property of the parish and should not be used for operating expenses. Thanks for your cooperation. FLEXIBLE SPENDING ACCOUNTS (FSA) AND DEPENDENT CARE (DC) BENEFIT TIMELINE

The monthly FSA and DC deductions are drafted from the parish or school account on the last business day of each month. Please be sure to reconcile the employee payroll deductions with the BAS election amount and the amount drafted by the Finance Office each month. Please be sure to update your payroll deduction amounts for the Plan year for employees who have either terminated their participation or newly elected to participate in the Plan. ACH PAYMENT OF MONTHLY BAS INVOICE

Locations can have their monthly BAS invoice paid automatically via an ACH draft by the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. There are a number of locations that have chosen this option of payment. The Finance Office will draft the monthly premium amount from the location bank account on the 5th day of the month for the current month billing (December premium drafted on December 5th). RATE ON INVESTMENT NOTES

The interest rate paid on Archdiocesan investment notes is currently 2.60%. The rate will change on March 16, 2015 and will remain in effect from March 16, 2015 through September 15, 2015. PARISH ACCOUNTING SOFTWARE

While reviewing the financial reports for the year ended June 30, 2014, we discovered that some bank accounts were not being recorded in the ConnectNow system. All bank accounts and the related transactions pertaining to the parish should be recorded in the ParishSoft system. We also noted that some parishes enter restricted donations and expenditures into liability accounts rather than income/expense accounts. To enhance the reporting of restricted amounts, we have added an "Entity" named "Restricted" to the parish available chart of accounts. The code for this entity is 55. All donations received which are **restricted by the donor** should be entered either in entity 50 Capital Campaign, 55 Restricted, or 91 Other. Expenditures for the restricted purpose can also be entered in the entity being used (50, 55 or 91). If you have questions regarding the recording of the restricted funds, please contact Steve Burger (sburger@catholiccincinnati.org) or Dan Umberg (dumberg@catholiccincinnati.org).

If our parish auditor contacts you regarding a review of your accounting system, he/she may require access to your ConnectNow system. The administrator can grant access by creating a new user with read-only privileges. The process for setting this up (including "read-only privileges") is included in the user guide in your ConnectNow package. If you have questions regarding this, please let us know.

Remember that Videos, Release Notes, the User Guide and Online Help Articles are available to review on your "Ledgers and Payables" screen in the ConnectNow System (ParishSoft). These sources provide answers to many common and not-so-common questions regarding bookkeeping and the accounting system.

We would like to remind the users of ConnectNow System that assistance with ConnectNow accounting is available by contacting the Archdiocesan Finance Office. Various parish business managers and parish accountants also have volunteered to assist/train employees of other parishes. NOTE: We will be removing the Parish Master Financial Report Form from the website. This report will no longer be used since all reports should be generated through the ParishSoft Software system.

FROM THE DESK OF THE SENIOR AUDITOR

I would like to welcome **Debbie Wait** to the audit group. She has extensive background in internal auditing and has been a business manager at Immaculate Heart of Mary and Our Lady of Victory. She is a great addition to the team and will be a valuable resource for all our locations. One of the goals of the audit group is to assist parishes and schools to improve their controls and financial reporting. To assist parishes and schools in putting together policies and procedures we are producing guidelines. Each guideline will address a specific area, will be made available in a Microsoft Word "read only" format, and will be uploaded to the Archdiocesan website. Guideline # XVIII Priest Compensation is now available and will be uploaded to our website.

In keeping with last month's fraud discussion, we will look at a second way our former business manager, Sean Martin, was able to take advantage of his former employers.

THE FRAUD

Disbursements and access to electronic payments was another area that was targeted. At several of his former locations he was a signatory on the bank account and the only individual who had access to the bank statements and online banking. He completed several types of frauds in this area.

- 1. The parish was still on QuickBooks, which allowed a check to be printed in his name and then the vendor name was changed in the system to cover up the disbursement.
- 2. An electronic payment was made to various vendors for personal expenditures and the expense was hidden in various accounts.
- 3. The business manager was a sole signatory on the account so checks were printed for personal expenses and changed against various expense codes.

Red Flags

- Invoices are not reviewed and approved by the requesting individual.
- The same individual processes the invoice, prints the check, then signs and sends the check.
- The Pastor or second signatory on the checks fails to review the invoice prior to signing the checks.
- The Pastor or his designee never reviews the bank statement.
- The Pastor or his designee never reviews the bank reconciliation.

Bank statements were not reviewed monthly therefore the fraud was able to go undetected for an extended period of time.

PREVENT, DETECT OR DETER

The above case illustrates one of the possible ways a fraud can occur at your location. It may not be possible to eliminate all fraud; it is possible to reduce the risk. Implementing standard controls may allow an organization to **prevent**, **detect or deter** a fraud. The following are suggestions that may have accomplished these goals:

Review Bank Statements and Bank Reconciliations

We recommend that the Pastor or his designee review the bank statements for any unusual checks or other transactions and initial the statements before giving them to the business manager, bookkeeper or other individual to perform the reconciliation. The review of the bank statement will ensure that unusual items are investigated on a timely basis. In addition, the Pastor or his designee should periodically review, approve, and sign the bank reconciliation.

Document Receiving

We recommend that all invoices be marked "OK to Pay" or a rubber stamp providing spaces for such approvals be adopted and that employees responsible for making such approvals be instructed to insert their initials in the spaces provided. Reviewing and approving documentation supporting payments of vendor invoices will help ensure that all payments are for valid expenses and reduce the risk of fraud and errors.

Supporting Documents Accompany Checks Submitted for Signature

We recommend that invoices and supporting documents bearing the appropriate approvals and other information accompany checks submitted for signature.

Automated Clearing House (ACH) Payments

Automated Clearing House (ACH) payments refer to a mechanism by which banks are able to transfer money directly from one account to another (held by a different party) at the request of the owner of the first account. Many online banking services allow users to conduct small transfers of this type automatically, often hidden within an option such as "make a payment." We recommend that all ACH payments be reviewed by the Pastor or his designee and marked "OK to Pay" or through the use of a rubber stamp providing spaces for such approvals. Reviewing individual charges and approving supporting invoices will ensure that all payments are for valid expenses and reduce the risk of fraud and errors.

DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES

The Archdiocese of Cincinnati (AOC) Human Resources Department continues to provide guidance and support to the many parishes and schools throughout the AOC. Recently we have received a number of inquiries about FMLA leaves for the birth of a child; more specifically, how these leaves are paid and for how long. We always refer the person back to the parish policies with the understanding that each parish makes this determination. Given the number of calls we have had about this subject, however, we encourage you to review your FMLA maternity/paternity paid leave policy. We would also like to remind you that there are model policies for parishes on the Human Resources page of the AOC website. Know that the HR Department is here to provide guidance and direction should you need it. Questions are welcome.

On a broader note, with a new year upon us, we encourage all parishes to make sure that they have personnel policies in place at their location. Again, the Human Resources Department can assist parishes with this task, providing as much or as little guidance as each parish desires.

February and March are the prime recruitment months for school principals. In the event your school principal is not intending to return, you will want to know this sooner rather than later as the recruitment season is upon us. That said, January through mid-February is a good time period in which to provide your principal with his/her "Intent to Return" form.

This includes the person(s) requesting the blessing, or from a priest familiar with the person(s), attesting to his/her/their good standing in the Catholic Church. The request should be on the parish letterhead and have the parish seal. The printed certificate comes from the Apostolic Nunciature, 3339 Massachusetts Avenue, Washington, DC 20008 (please allow 2-3 months for delivery). An offering of \$20.00 is customary and should be made by check or money order, payable to the "Apostolic Nunciature" for the printed certificate. The blessing from the Apostolic Nuncio is in a letter format (8-1/2 x 11'). The Apostolic Blessing is granted for the following occasions:

- 1. Baptism, First Communion, Confirmation
- 2. Marriage
- 3. Priestly Ordination
- 4. Religious Profession
- 5. Secular Consecration
- 6. Ordinations of Permanent Deacons
- 7. Marriage Anniversaries (10, 25, 40, 50, 60 years)*, Priestly Ordination, Religious Profession
- 8. Birthdays (18, 50, 60, 70, 80, 90, 100)*
- 9. Catholic individuals or families (with name and surname of the spouses united in a religious marriage).

The asterisk (*) indicates the need for the nihil obstat or approval of ecclesiastical authority. Requests for papal blessings for other occasions will not be accepted.

CATHOLIC YOUTH ATHLETICS INITIATIVE AND CHARTER IMPLEMENTATION Here's a snapshot of Youth Athletics Initiative developments (please forward to your athletics leaders):

1. Cincinnati CYO will dissolve as of the end of May: It is with great gratitude to the board and the staff of the Catholic Youth Sports Organization, Inc. (Cincinnati CYO) that we offer this important update to Cincinnati-area leaders of Catholic Youth Athletics. On December 22, 2014, Bill Rice, President of the Catholic Youth Sports Organization, Inc., informed the Commission of their decision to dissolve as of the end of this school year. The Catholic Youth Sports Organization, Inc., (Cincinnati CYO) is an independent, non-profit organization that has served Catholic parishes and schools for fifteen years by organizing league play, competitions, and tournaments. We are most grateful for their long years of faithful service.

The Commission has begun work on plans to respond to both the immediate and long-term opportunities presented by the Cincinnati CYO's decision. In the short-term, the Commission will be leading the way in helping develop interim plans so the parishes, schools, kids, and teams that participate in the Cincinnati CYO will continue through 2015 and beyond.

To lead the way, a special Task Force is being organized by the "Key Three" leadership of the Commission (Youth Athletics Chaplain Deacon David Profitt; Dr. Sean Reynolds, Director of the Archdiocesan Office of Youth & Young Adult Ministry; and Greg Tankersley of St. Ignatius Parish and LaSalle High School). Greg will be heading up the Task Force, assisted by area athletics' leaders and Don Back (the Commission's Chair of its Subcommittee on Leagues). This is a confidential, dedicated line to accept calls related to child abuse by employees or volunteers. In addition, be sure to notify the survivor's secular legal authorities.

REPORTING FINANCIAL MISCONDUCT - In a spirit of good stewardship, the Archdiocese of Cincinnati has instituted a financial misconduct hotline to allow employees, volunteers, vendors and other interested parties to report what they believe to be financial misconduct at any level – parish, deanery or Archdiocese. As an additional safeguard, the hotline is administered by an independent third-party company, EthicsPoint.
