OFFICE OF SAFE ENVIRONMENT FOR THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN AND YOUTH

BACKGROUND CHECK / CHILD PROTECTION REQUIRMENTS

All "employees" and "regular volunteers" as defined in the July 1, 2013 *Decree on Child Protection (Decree*) must receive an acceptable background check, and must attend a VIRTUS ® Child Awareness Session on the *Decree* before they can have contact with children. If any employee or regular volunteer has not received an acceptable background check result and

/or not attended a VIRTUS ® Child Awareness Session on the *Decree*, that employee or regular volunteer is not approved to have contact with children and may not have contact with children. In addition, all new employees within the Archdiocese of Cincinnati must complete and sign a B.4 Form and send them to the Office of Safe Environment for Protection of Children and Youth before the new employee can begin having contact with children.

ANNUAL USCCB AUDIT CERTIFICATION LETTERS

All pastors, parish administrators, principals and other leaders of Archdiocese of Cincinnati institutions will be receiving a letter asking them to certify that their institutions have received and implemented the Archdiocese *Decree on Child Protection* during the USCCB audit period and fiscal year July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016. The USCCB Auditors will review these signed letters during their live audit of the Archdiocese.**

STEUBENVILLE CONFERENCES

Adult Chaperone Verification Forms must be reviewed and signed by the Archdiocesan Safe Environment Coordinator. Chaperones' youth protection records will be reviewed to ensure they have completed VIRTUS training, have a current background check and are current on all monthly bulletins. Submit all applications three weeks prior to the conference date to ensure timely processing.

VIRTUS® ACCOUNTS CLEANUP

The Safe Environment Office will be identifying individuals who are **significantly out of compliance** and will be inactivating their accounts on the following schedule.

Accounts created in 2014, but have not taken training, will be deleted in July. Additionally, all sign-in sheets from 2014 will be shredded in July.

July - inactivating any individual with a background check over six years old August – inactivating any individual who is 15 or more behind on their bulletins September – inactivating any individual with a background check before January 1, 2011

PROCEDURE CHANGES

In order to ensure the reliability and accuracy of the manual fingerprint background results, we are unable to accept fingerprint results from individuals. All fingerprint results must be received directly form the organization conducting the fingerprinting or in unopened envelopes from the organization.

We have made minor changes to the following procedures. The updated procedures were sent to all the Local Safe Environment Coordinators.

- Procedure A7 decreased from 18 to nine when the Archdiocese will inactivate someone's account. Remember that individuals cannot volunteer if they have three or more missing bulletins.
- Procedure B1 decreased the time period between training and obtaining a background check to three months. Remember that individuals cannot volunteer unless they have a background check and VIRTUS training.

ELDER DISCERNMENT GROUP

Starting this fall, the Vocation Office along with seminarian Jarred Kohn will be running an early morning discernment group at Elder High School for all men in 9th-12th grade attending Elder. All pastors who have men attending Elder are encouraged to send to the vocation office, no later than August 1, a list of young men from your parish who may be interested in this group.

FINANCE AND ACCOUNTING OFFICE

DRIVING POLICY

The Archdiocese of Cincinnati Driving Policy for employees of the Archdiocese and its affiliates covers the use and/or operation of vehicles while conducting Archdiocesan/affiliate business. The entire policy he located the Archdiocesan website http://www.catholiccincinnati.org/ministries-offices/human-resources-office/policies/. Personal autos or personally rented vehicles should not be used for Archdiocesan purposes unless adequately insured by the owner. At least \$100,000 Bodily Injury Liability Coverage and \$300,000 Property Damage Liability Coverage is needed. When renting a vehicle for Archdiocesan purposes, the employee is required to purchase the insurance coverage offered by the rental agency. The liability coverage of the vehicle owner is primary. Archdiocesan coverage is secondary.

FLEXIBLE SPENDING ACCOUNT UPDATE

The new administrator for Flexible Spending Accounts (FSA) is Benefit Allocation Systems (BAS). BAS will be processing any FSA claims incurred on or after July 1, 2016. To learn more about the FSA benefit through BAS, navigate to http://www.basusa.com/fsa-video-help. Employees have until September 30, 2016 to claim funds through Chard Snyder for eligible expenses incurred prior to June 30, 2016. After all claims incurred prior to June 30, 2016 have been processed *healthcare* only FSA balances up to \$500 will be rolled over to the employee's 2016/2017 account with BAS.

HOURS MEASUREMENT STILL REQUIRED BY THE AFFORDABLE CARE ACT (ACA)

Thank you for your continued efforts to record hours for the Affordable Care Act (ACA) measurement period of April 1, 2016 through March 31, 2017. The ACA requires that employers measure hours during a 12-month measurement period to determine which employees have earned the right to be offered health insurance coverage during the next Stability Period July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017. Each location is **required** to track and input hours worked for all employees in the Benefit Allocation System (BAS) MyEnroll portal. It is advantageous to handle the task of recording hours on a regular basis to avoid having to input all the information at the end of the measurement period. Detailed instructions for inputting hours in the BAS system are posted in the BAS Reference Library.

ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT - PARISHSOFT

All parishes and consolidated schools are required to submit an Annual Financial Report each year to the Finance Office. Please provide a copy of the following reports from the ParishSoft program for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2016:

- 1) Statement of Activities Columnar by Entity
- 2) Statement of Financial Position
- 3) ParishSoft cover page (available on website under Finance Office Documents)

The Finance Office will utilize the Statement of Activities – Columnar by Entity report to calculate the General Assessment bill. **This year's due date is August 31, 2016.** Please close the year before submitting to the Pastor, Finance Committee and Archdiocese. Please note that it is the responsibility of the parishes and consolidated schools to submit complete and balanced reports. The Finance Office may return any report that is out-of-balance or incomplete. The Financial Report must be examined by either the Finance Committee of the Parish Council or by a Certified Public Accounting Firm. In addition to submitting a Financial Report to the Finance Office, the pastor must publish a Financial Report to the members of the parish, including a separate report of the elementary school operations, by September 30 of each year. The report to the parishioners should contain the budget for the year reported, the actual experience, and the budget for the coming year. From the Desk of the Senior Auditor

The Archdiocese of Cincinnati began financial reviews several years ago as a method to assist parishes and schools with their financial management. As we discussed, we will take the next couple of months describing why and how we conduct the financial reviews.

What Documents do you look at?

Here are some examples. However, this is not a complete summary of all testing completed.

Receipts:

- We look at the weekly collection documentation to determine what controls are documented.
- Does the parish keep a posting to its donor records software that ties to known weekly collections by donor?
- Are receipts deposited intact?
- Are receipts posted to expense or liability accounts?
- We look at supporting documentation for tuition receipts.
- How are restricted contributions and interest on endowments being handled?

Banking:

- Does the location have a list of all bank accounts that use the location's tax ID number?
- Are all bank accounts included in the location's general ledger?
- Are all bank accounts included in the location's reporting to the Archdiocese and parishioners?
- Are all bank statements mailed to the Parish Office (or School Office) and a copy kept on file?
- Are all bank statements reconciled on a timely basis each month?
- Who reconciled the bank statements and who reviews the reconciliations?

- Do the bank reconciliations have outstanding journal entries or deposits older than one month?
- Do the bank reconciliations have outstanding checks older than one year?
- Are all bank transfers to other parish/school bank accounts?
- Is the location receiving interest on its account balances?

Compliance:

- Are minutes kept for the Finance Council and Parish Council (School Advisory Council) meetings?
- Has the parish adopted a document detailing Council's roles and responsibilities in accordance with the *Document on Temporal Affairs*?
- Does Parish Council (School Advisory Council) review and recommend a budget to the Pastor (Principal)?
- Were Independent Contractor agreements obtained? Were Performance Contracts obtained? Were current certificates of worker's compensation and general liability insurance obtained?
- Were repairs and equipment purchases over \$5,000 reviewed by Parish Council (School Advisory Council) prior to purchase? Did projects over \$25,000 obtain proper Archdiocesan approvals?
- Are W-9's being obtained from vendors and are 1099's and W-2G's being issued properly?
- Do the bank balances exceed the average of three months of the accounts disbursements?

We hope that the information from the past few months helps locations better understand the review process.

DEPARTMENT OF LABOR FINAL OVERTIME RULE

On May 18, 2016, the Department of Labor (DOL) issued the long-anticipated final overtime rule. Here are the highlights of the final rule:

- The annual salary threshold for exempt positions will jump from \$23,660 to \$47,476 (or from \$455 to \$913 per week). That is more than double the old threshold. With the exception of teachers and the clergy, employees who earn less than the threshold must be paid for over 40 hours worked in a workweek at a rate not less than time and one-half their regular hourly pay rate—even if they're currently classified as a manager or professional.
- There will be no change in the duties test used to determine whether employees earning more than the salary threshold must be classified as non-exempt from overtime, including the exemptions for executive, administrative and professional positions, among others.
- Automatic Salary Threshold Increases Every Three Years, as the DOL reduced the frequency of the automatic increases from annual increases to every three years.
- The new rule takes effect on December 1, 2016.

Please use the above effective date as a timeline for implementing any needed changes to your exempt/non-exempt classifications.

If you have not done so already, we recommend that you analyze the number of hours worked per week/month/year for each employee who is currently classified as exempt and whose salary is below \$47,476 per year. This analysis is necessary so that an accurate hourly rate can be established when the employee is converted to non-exempt status. In other words, the goal is to set an hourly rate that will, as closely as possible, result in the employee being paid the same yearly salary as he or she is currently paid. Please pay close attention to any overtime hours (i.e., hours over 40 per week) that the employee works, as these hours will need to be factored into the setting of the hourly rate. By way of example, an employee who regularly works five hours of overtime per week will require the setting of a lower hourly rate to offset the overtime premium of "time and a half" for each hour of overtime.

REDUCTION IN FORCE (RIF) OR TERMINATION

If your parish or school has a Reduction in Force (RIF) or the need to terminate an employee, it is important that you supply the terminated employee the proper paperwork. When a RIF occurs, the Continuation of Coverage Letter and the Continuation of Coverage Rights should be given to the employee. These documents outline the options available in regard to continuation of health care coverage up to 12 months. FEAST OF MARY MAGDALENE

In June, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Sacraments announced that Pope Francis raised the liturgical calendar rank of St. Mary Magdalene from an obligatory memorial to a feast. Archbishop Roche, secretary of the CDWS, wrote that Pope Francis sees the change in the liturgical rank of Mary Magdalene, the "Apostle of the Apostles," as one way for the Church to "reflect more deeply on the dignity of women, the new evangelization and the greatness of the mystery of divine mercy." The rank of "feast" is like that of the Apostles. Therefore, on July 22, the liturgy for the Feast of St. Mary Magdalene will include a Gloria, along with a proper preface entitled *de apostolorum apostola* (Apostle of the Apostles). Once an approved English translation is available, then it is to be used. Other liturgical texts for Mary Magdalene already provided in the liturgical books are to be used.

ORDER OF CELEBRATING MATRIMONY

The new *Order of Celebrating Matrimony* will be available in late August and may be used in the liturgy beginning September 8, 2016. Its mandatory use will begin on December 30, 2016. The Priestly Formation Office, the Office of the Diaconate, the Family and Respect Life Office,

and the Worship Office are preparing for diocesan workshops in late summer or early fall. Information will be available soon.
