LENTEN REMINDERS - FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday, February 10, 2016, and Good Friday, March 25, 2016, are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast, that is, limited to a single full meal. The other Fridays of the season of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (canons 97 and 1252). With regard to Good Friday, the teaching of the Second Vatican Council should be recalled.

Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection may be attained with uplifted and clear mind (*Constitution on the Liturgy, No. 110*).

With regard to the obligatory days listed above, however, there are frequent questions about the degree of seriousness of the matter. The teaching of Pope John Paul II may be simply paraphrased: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe an individual day of penance is not considered serious. People should seek to do more rather than less. Fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimum response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion.

CONFIRMATION AND THE FACULTY TO CONFIRM

The following might be helpful for you regarding Confirmation at the Easter Vigil. For priests who have been granted the faculties of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, these are the instructions for the Faculty to Confirm as found in the *Pagella*, Clerus Cincinnatensis, Volume XII, No. 1, pages 260-261. The mandate is given to all priests in the Archdiocese:

- 1. **to baptize and confirm** in accordance with canon 883.2 persons who are no longer infants whom the priest judges suitable for Catholic baptism;
- 2. **to admit into full communion** with the Catholic Church **and to confirm** in accordance with canon 883.2 previously baptized persons who are no longer infants whom the priest judges suitable for admission to the Catholic Church;

3. **to readmit into full communion** with the Catholic Church and **to confirm** in accordance with the response to the Pontifical Commission for the Interpretation of the Decrees of the Second Vatican Council, April 25, 1975, persons beyond infancy who were baptized Catholic but not confirmed and who later became an apostate or a heretic, whom the priest judges suitable for readmission to the Catholic Church. (If you have any questions about whether or not someone later became an apostate or a heretic, please call the Chancery.)

Priests do not have the faculty to confirm a baptized but never confirmed Catholic who simply has not been active in the practice of the faith without becoming a member of another Church and now desires to be confirmed and be actively involved in the Church's life. In these cases, individual delegation of the archbishop is needed. Priests can seek such delegation in writing from the Chancery, giving reasons why the delegation is sought, the name of the person to be delegated, the name of thfe candidate, and the intended date of the ceremony.

If you need to request a faculty to confirm, please do so in ample time to receive it before the Easter Vigil. Also, if you have more than one parish, please include the name of the parish where the Confirmation will take place. Thank you.

The Good Friday collection is to be taken up in all churches and chapels where Good Friday services are celebrated. The proceeds will benefit the churches in the Holy Land. ARCHDIOCESE OF CINCINNATI FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

INTEREST RATES

The amount paid for investments placed with the Archdiocese will remain unchanged. The rate on Archdiocesan Investment Notes for the period March 16, 2016 through September 15, 2016 will be 2.50%. The Archdiocesan Loan Rate will remain at 6.50%.

HEALTH CARE PLAN CHANGES FISCAL YEAR 2016-2017

Effective July 1, 2016: the monthly premium rates charged to locations is changing from \$645.00 to \$651.00 for single coverage, from \$1,501.00 to \$1,516.00 for family coverage, and from \$294.00 to \$297.00 for retiree supplemental coverage. There is no change in the monthly employee health care contribution rate of \$32.00 for single coverage and \$75.00 for family coverage.

The annual deductible will remain unchanged at \$425 for single coverage, and \$850 for family coverage. The deductible covers a <u>calendar year</u>, not plan year. The annual Out-Of-Pocket (OOP) Maximum is changing from \$2,200 to \$2,300 for single coverage and from \$4,400 to \$4,600 for family coverage. The OOP covers a calendar year, not plan year.

The Standard Insurance Company has increased rates for the Archdiocesan Basic Core Life and Accidental Death and Dismemberment insurance for the 2016-2017 plan year as follows:

The Long Term Disability rate is not changing; it remains at 0.00272 of pre-disability annual earnings.

PRIESTS' RETIREMENT MONTHLY CONTRIBUTION

Since July 2011, Archdiocesan locations that employ a Diocesan priest have been making monthly contributions into the Priests' Retirement Fund. Effective July 1, 2016, that monthly per priest charge will increase from \$400 to \$500.

The Archdiocese Finance Office will continue to draft the appropriate amount from each location's bank account on file the last business day of each month based on the number of Diocesan priests assigned. Please be sure to notify the Finance Office of any changes in banking information. Locations that share a priest are required to contribute their share of the cost. The Finance Office will draft the funds from the location from which the priest is paid and the other location should then reimburse the location from which the funds were drafted for their share of the monthly cost.

- Those locations that employ religious order priests should continue to make the appropriate arrangements with the provincial at the religious order to remit the retirement amounts directly to them.
- The Archdiocese of Cincinnati 401(k) Plan was amended to include new priests. The definition 'Covered Priest' means any diocesan priest who is ordained into the Archdiocese of Cincinnati after January 1, 2015, or any diocesan priest whose

incardination date into the Archdiocese of Cincinnati is on or after January 1, 2016, or any priest who is not subject to a vow of poverty and is on canonical assignment, beginning on or after January 1, 2016, to the Archdiocese of Cincinnati from another diocese or religious order. Each location will contribute the same monthly \$500 contribution towards retirement except it will be processed through the Fifth Third site on a quarterly basis as it is currently processed for eligible lay employees. The Finance Office will work directly with the locations to establish correct procedure on the Fifth Third site.

From the Desk of the Senior Auditor

We started Financial Reviews several years ago as a method to assist parishes and schools with their financial management. In a recent meeting, a business manager and pastor described their frustration at not knowing what to expect, not understanding what we do, why we do it, how it is completed. Based on this conversation we will take the next couple months describing why and how we conduct the financial reviews.

The document *Diocesan Financial Issues* was developed by the Committee on Budget and Finance of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). It best describes why the Archdiocese of Cincinnati has the Parish Auditor group to provide service to each parish and school.

12. Internal Audits

Each diocese should implement some level of internal audit. Such a function is a very important component of a sound internal control environment for parishes, schools and other diocesan entities.

The primary role of the internal audit function is to aid pastors and others in fulfilling their canonical and legal responsibilities. An effective internal audit will help safeguard the assets of a

parish, review recordkeeping, accounting and financial reporting of the parish, identify areas of improvement and report findings and observations to the pastor, parish finance council and the audit or accounting committee of the diocese. Ideally, the internal auditors serve as pro-active, cooperative management advisory partners to the pastor. A well-developed internal audit team will function most effectively as consultants rather than compliance monitors, adding value through reviewing the parish business operation and making recommendations for improvement. An internal audit also provides an independent review and verification that an organization is complying with laws and policies of the diocese and is making economical and efficient use of its resources. An internal audit assists management by providing independent and objective analysis of activities and controls. Internal audits are an objective review of the policies and systems a parish, school or other diocesan entity has in place that sometimes are never tested. Thus, an internal audit is designed to determine whether internal controls are in place and functioning so as to safeguard assets, provide reasonable assurance that financial activities are being properly recorded, summarized and reported, and provide reasonable assurance of compliance with diocesan policies and civil regulations.

DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES

The Human Resources Department wants to remind all pastors of the *Policy Guidelines for Parishes* that can be found on the Human Resources page of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati website. The *Policy Guidelines for Parishes* is a compilation of suggested policies and procedures assembled in the form of a Handbook that all parishes can use in its present format or use as a starting point for adapting to reflect local policies and procedures.

We can't stress enough the importance of having a Parish Policy/Procedure Handbook in place at your parish. A handbook ensures that all employees know the behavioral and procedural parameters around their employment. A handbook also helps to ensure that your employees are treated equally in similar situations, which goes a long way in protecting the parish in the event of possible employment-related legal action.

UPDATED STATUS OF DEPARTMENT OF LABOR FINAL RULE

In July 2015, the Department of Labor ("DOL") released a proposed rule expanding the current overtime requirements to an additional five million workers. The proposed rule more than doubles the current salary minimum required for exempt status from \$455 per week (\$23,660 per year) to a projected level of \$970 per week (\$50,440 per year in 2016). Under the proposed rule, 40% of full-time salaried workers would lose their exempt status. The impact on parishes and schools will be significant. With the exception of teachers and the clergy, any employee who does not make the threshold salary (i.e., \$50,440 in the proposed rule) will automatically be considered non-exempt and, therefore, subject to the minimum wage, overtime and recordkeeping requirements of the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA).

Two months ago, the DOL indicated that it was targeting July 2016 for the release of the final rule. This deadline, however, appears to be moving up. DOL Secretary Thomas Perez said in a recent interview that his agency is confident that a final rule will be published by the spring of 2016. There was no indication of any change in the anticipated effective date—that is, once the final rule is published employers will have just 60 days to comply.

Please use the above timeline as an opportunity to review your exempt/non-exempt classifications and consider how these potential changes will impact you.

TIME FOR THE EASTER VIGIL

The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* states that the Easter Vigil is to be celebrated in darkness. Therefore, this year the Easter Vigil may begin at 8:45 p.m. or later.

SCRUTINIES

In this final period of preparation for the Sacraments of Initiation, the three Scrutinies are to be celebrated with the Elect on the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent using the Cycle A readings. (cf. RCIA, 20, 146) Please note, "The bishop may dispense from one of them for serious reasons or, in extraordinary circumstances, even from two" (RCIA, 20).

PASCHAL TRIDUUM RESOURCES

HOLY THURSDAY, WASHING OF THE FEET:

On the authority of Pope Francis, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments [CDWDS] issued a Decree and a Commentary on 6 January 2016 changing the rubric for the Washing of the Feet during the Evening Mass on Thursday of the Lord's Supper. Here is the rubric:

Those who have been chosen from amongst the people of God are led by the ministers to seats prepared in a suitable place. Then the Priest (removing the chasuble if necessary) goes to each one, and, with the help of the ministers, pours water over each one's feet and then dries them.

By the action of the Apostolic See, those chosen for the foot washing is open to all members of the People of God – boys and girls, women and men. Those chosen for the foot washing reflect all who make up the People of God, the disciples of the Lord.

In the account of the Last Supper in the Gospel of John, the Good News proclaimed during the Holy Thursday Evening Mass, Jesus washes the feet of an unspecified number of disciples. Just as the "beloved disciple" is nameless so that it may be, in fact, every hearer who is the beloved one, the "disciples" are all of us as well. This *mandatum*, this love command to be of service, to be servants is given to each one of the baptized.

Some feet are washed during the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper as another reminder to be like Jesus. No task, no service, no gesture is beneath those who bear the name Christian.

Caring for Creation Tip: Lent's Meatless Fridays -- Why not continue this practice throughout the year? Going meatless just once a week can help reduce our carbon footprint and save precious resources like fresh water and fossil fuel.
