AMENDMENT TO TEMPORAL AFFAIRS DOCUMENT

After consultation with the Archdiocesan Presbyteral Council on Monday, May 16, 2016, Archbishop Schnurr has amended the Extra Synodal Temporal Affairs Document of July 1, 1995 regarding the five mandatory collections in which the entire collection on that Sunday must be forwarded to the Archdiocese for the designated purpose. Those collections effective May 19, 2016 will now be **second** collections that will be forwarded for the designated purpose. The amended Decree is included as an insert in this edition of Clergy Communications. Please place this Decree with the Temporal Affairs Document in the Parish.

CHANGES IN THE MARRIAGE PREPARATION GUIDELINES

Archbishop Schnurr affirms the right of Catholics to celebrate the Rite of Marriage within Mass. Priests can use their own discretion in allowing a Catholic and a baptized person who is a member of a church or ecclesial communion which is not in full communion with the Catholic Church celebrate marriage within Mass. A general invitation to receive Holy Communion is NEVER to be offered.

In the case of celebrating marriage when there is a disparity of cult, the Rite of Marriage within Mass can be celebrated with written permission from the Archbishop. A general invitation to receive Holy Communion is NEVER to be offered.

In light of the new Rite of Matrimony to be released to the public in August and fully implemented beginning December 30, 2016, the release of *Amoris Laetitia* as well as the developments in the area of Theology of the Body and evangelization, the Marriage Guidelines will be updated and workshops for celebrating the New Rite will take place in late summer and early fall.

MICROFILMING OF SACRAMENTAL REGISTERS

Every five years, the sacramental registers of the parishes and institutions of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati are scanned and microfilmed. All parishes and institutions are required to have **Baptism**, **Confirmation**, **Marriage**, and **Death** registers dating from **July 1**, **2011** to **June 30**, **2016** microfilmed. Every parish will be sent a letter detailing the process and timeline of this project to begin in August 2016. OFFICE OF SAFE ENVIRONMENT FOR THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN AND YOUTH

BACKGROUND CHECK / CHILD PROTECTION REQUIRMENTS

All "employees" and "regular volunteers" as defined in the July 1, 2013 *Decree on Child Protection (Decree)* must receive an acceptable background check, and must attend a VIRTUS ® Child Awareness Session on the *Decree* before they can have contact with children. If any employee or regular volunteer has not received an acceptable background check result and /or not attended a VIRTUS ® Child Awareness Session on the *Decree*, that employee or regular volunteer is not approved to have contact with children and may not have contact with children. In addition, all new employees within the Archdiocese of Cincinnati must complete and sign a B.4 Form and send them to the Office of Safe Environment for Protection of Children and Youth before the new employee can begin having contact with children.

ANNUAL USCCB AUDIT CERTIFICATION LETTERS

All pastors, parish administrators, principals and other leaders of Archdiocese of Cincinnati institutions will be receiving a letter asking them to certify that their institutions have received and implemented the Archdiocese *Decree on Child Protection* during the USCCB audit period and fiscal year July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016. Please sign and **return those letters to Joe Riede via email: jriede@catholiccincinnati.org or fax (513.421.6225)**. The USCCB Auditors will review these signed letters during their live audit of the Archdiocese.

STEUBENVILLE CONFERENCES

Adult Chaperone Verification Forms must be reviewed and signed by the Archdiocesan Safe Environment Coordinator. Chaperones' youth protection records will be reviewed to ensure they have completed VIRTUS training, have a current background check and are current on all monthly bulletins. All employees must have completed a B.4. The local Safe Environment Coordinator should review each individual's records prior to being submitted to the Archdiocese. If any of these items are not current or have not been completed, the individual will not be approved. Submit all applications three weeks prior to the conference date to ensure timely processing.

VIRTUS® ACCOUNTS CLEANUP

The Safe Environment Office we will be identifying individuals who are **significantly out of compliance** and will be inactivating their accounts on the following schedule.

June - inactivating any individual who is 18 or more behind on their bulletins July - inactivating any individual with a background check over 6 years old August – inactivating any individual who is 15 or more behind on their bulletins

OPEN ENROLLMENT

"Thank you" to pastors, business managers and employees for taking part in this year's successful Open Enrollment process. Over 4,700 employees participated in the MyEnroll *Benefit Allocation System*. FLEXIBLE SPENDING ACCOUNT UPDATE:

As was communicated during Open Enrollment, the Archdiocese of Cincinnati will transition to a new Flexible Spending Account (FSA) plan administrator for the 2016/2017 plan year. Benefit Allocation Systems (BAS) will be the new vendor replacing Chard Snyder. Business Managers, as well as employees will experience some changes from the current process due to this transition. Ultimately, the transition to BAS will allow for a more streamlined experience.

Employee Communication - In order to ensure the smoothest transition possible, a direct communication will be sent in June to employees with Flexible Spending Accounts.

Benny Cards - New Benny Cards for the 2016/2017 plan year will arrive by 7/1/16 and will replace the current Benny Cards. The 2015-2016 Benny Cards will be deactivated on 6/30/16.

2015/2016 Run-Out Period: Chard Snyder will continue to process run-out claims for expenses incurred through June 30, 2016. Those claims will be processed by Chard Snyder between July 1, 2016 through September 30, 2016.

2015/2016 rollover amounts up to \$500 will be applied to the 2016/2017 FSA accounts administered by BAS following the close of the run-out period with Chard Snyder. Any remaining 2015/2016 balances of over \$500 will be forfeited. Rollover dollars will be applied to the 2016/2017 FSA accounts in the month of October.

EMPLOYEE BENEFITS QUICK REFERENCE

POOLED FUND

The Pooled Fund rate paid on the checking accounts not evidenced by a green savings certificate (these certificates are issued by the Finance Office) will be reduced by 0.1% (10 basis points) beginning with the June 30, 2016 crediting calculation. This reduction represents a service charge and the funds generated will be transferred directly to U.S. Bank as Trustee for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati Lay Employees' Pension Plan. The green certificate rate will not be affected by this change. Please call Rich Kelly at 513.421.3131x2840 with any questions.

From the Desk of the Senior Auditor

The Archdiocese of Cincinnati began financial reviews several years ago as a method to assist parishes and schools with their financial management. As we discussed, we will take the next couple of months describing why and how we conduct the financial reviews.

What Documents do you look at?

Here are some examples, however, this is not a complete summary of all testing completed.

Payroll

- We look at a current payroll register to see which employees are paid hourly, salary (non-exempt and exempt) or contract school employees. We consult the AOC Human Resources personnel to determine the propriety of these classifications of workers.
- We look for support of the hours paid and the wage rate paid.
- Is overtime being properly paid?
- Are all employees regularly working 20 hours or more per week receiving the employer portion of 401(k)?
- Is the 401(k) employee withholding and employer portion being remitted to third-party administrator on a timely basis?
- Were all employees eligible, offered health care?

Disbursements:

- We look at all checks written to staff and select a sample to examine supporting documentation.
- We look if disbursements are posted to revenue or liability accounts.
- Are all payments for transportation supported by an original invoice or a mileage log that includes date, purpose of trip, and miles driven?
- Consult with AOC Human Resources personnel regarding individuals paid through payables to determine if proper as independent contractors or if they should be considered employees.
- Were 1099's and W-2G's issued in accordance with IRS rules?
- Did gift cards or checks given to employees get processed through payroll?
- Were gift cards or checks or cash given to volunteers?
- Is reimbursement given for employee's tuition paid or is tuition paid for employees or their children?
- Is an allowance given to employee for use of their personal cell phone?
- Does the location have documentation for scholarship funds, other restricted funds or endowment funds?
- We look at a sample of checks and examine supporting documentation for segregation of duties and controls.

Reporting:

- Was annual reporting given to parishioners by October 1 each year?
- Did the annual report conform to the directions in the *Document on Temporal Affairs*?
- Does the annual report to the parishioners agree to the financial records of the parish?

Over the next several months we will provide examples of what documents we may examine.

DEPARTMENT OF LABOR FINAL OVERTIME RULE

On May 18, 2016, the Department of Labor (DOL) issued the long-anticipated final overtime rule. Here are the highlights of the final rule:

- The annual salary threshold for exempt positions will jump from \$23,660 to \$47,476 (or from \$455 to \$913 per week). That is more than double the old threshold. With the exception of teachers and the clergy, employees who earn less than the threshold must be paid for over 40 hours worked in a workweek at a rate not less than time and one-half their regular hourly pay rate—even if they're currently classified as a manager or professional.
- There will be no change in the duties test used to determine whether employees earning more than the salary threshold must be classified as non-exempt from overtime, including the exemptions for executive, administrative and professional positions, among others.
- Automatic Salary Threshold Increases Every 3 Years, as the DOL reduced the frequency of the automatic increases from annual increases to every 3 years.
- The new rule takes effect on December 1, 2016.

Please use the above effective date as a timeline for implementing any needed changes to your exempt/non-exempt classifications.

Caring for Creation Tip:

Here are some handy tips to minimize your impact on the environment from your car:

- When you aren't in traffic, turn off the engine rather than idle for more than 30 seconds. Many communities in the Archdiocese rank alarmingly high nationally for particulate pollution. This is the microscopic bits of matter that when inhaled can cause chronic health problems.
- Be aware of your speed obeying highway speed limits can save fuel, as well as prevent pollution.
- Avoid rapid accelerations and braking, which burn more fuel.
- Use cruise control and overdrive gears.
- Remove excess weight from your trunk, and if you have a removable roof rack and aren't using it, take it off.
- Gas fumes are harmful to you and the environment. Topping off your tank beyond the automatic shutoff point will cause fuel spills and emit more toxic fumes into the air.
- In very hot weather try to refuel early in the cooler morning or late evening hours to limit your exposure to fumes.
- If you live in an area that has Ozone Action Days, try to avoid filling up on those days.
- Keep your tires properly inflated: low tire pressure reduces fuel economy.
- Replace your air filter regularly. a clogged air filter can reduce fuel economy significantly
