OFFICE OF SAFE ENVIRONMENT FOR THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN AND YOUTH

BACKGROUND CHECK / CHILD PROTECTION REQUIRMENTS

All "employees" and "regular volunteers" as defined in the July 1, 2013 Decree on Child Protection (Decree) must receive an acceptable background check, and must attend a VIRTUS ® Child Awareness Session on the Decree before they can have contact with children. If any employee or regular volunteer has not received an acceptable background check result and / or not attended a VIRTUS ® Child Awareness Session on the Decree, that employee or regular volunteer is not approved to have contact with children and may not have contact with children. In addition, all new employees within the Archdiocese of Cincinnati must complete and sign a B.4 Form and send them to the Office of Safe Environment for Protection of Children and Youth before the new employee can begin having contact with children.

ANNUAL USCCB AUDIT CERTIFICATION LETTERS

All pastors, parish administrators, principals and other leaders of Archdiocese of Cincinnati institutions will be receiving a letter asking them to certify that their institutions have received and implemented the Archdiocese *Decree on Child Protection* during the USCCB audit period and fiscal year July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016. Please sign and return those letters to Joe Riede via email: jriede@catholiccincinnati.org or fax (513.421.6225). The USCCB Auditors will review these signed letters during their live audit of the Archdiocese.

STEUBENVILLE CONFERENCES

Adult Chaperone Verification Forms must be reviewed and signed by the Archdiocesan Safe Environment Coordinator. Chaperones' youth protection records will be reviewed to ensure they have completed VIRTUS training, have a current background check and are current on all monthly bulletins. All employees must have completed a B.4. The local Safe Environment Coordinator should review each individual's records prior to being submitted to the Archdiocese. If any of these items are not current or have not been completed, the individual will not be approved. Submit all applications three weeks prior to the conference date to ensure timely processing.

VIRTUS® ACCOUNTS CLEANUP

The Safe Environment Office we will be identifying individuals who are **significantly out of compliance** and will be inactivating their accounts on the following schedule.

May - inactivating any individual with a background check over 8 years old

June - inactivating any individual who is 18 or more behind on their bulletins

July - inactivating any individual with a background check over 6 years old

THE RETIREMENT FUND FOR RELIGIOUS

FINANCE AND ACCOUNTING OFFICE

PRIESTS' RETIREMENT MONTHLY CONTRIBUTION

Since July 2011, Archdiocesan locations that employ a Diocesan priest have been making monthly contributions into the Priests' Retirement Fund. Effective July 1, 2016, that monthly per priest charge will increase from \$400 to \$500.

The Archdiocese Finance Office will continue to draft the appropriate amount from each location's bank account on file the last business day of each month based on the number of Diocesan priests assigned. Please be sure to notify the Finance Office of any changes in banking information. Locations that share a priest are required to contribute their share of the cost. The Finance Office will draft the funds from the location from which the priest is paid and the other location should then reimburse the location from which the funds were drafted for their share of the monthly cost.

- Those locations that employ religious order priests should continue to make the appropriate arrangements with the provincial at the religious order to remit the retirement amounts directly to them.
- The Archdiocese of Cincinnati 401(k) Plan was amended to include new priests. The definition 'Covered Priest' means any diocesan priest who is ordained into the Archdiocese of Cincinnati after January 1, 2015, or any diocesan priest whose incardination date into the Archdiocese of Cincinnati is on or after January 1, 2016, or any priest who is not subject to a vow of poverty and is on canonical assignment, beginning on or after January 1, 2016, to the Archdiocese of Cincinnati from another diocese or religious order. Each location will contribute the same monthly \$500 contribution towards retirement except it will be processed through the Fifth Third site on a quarterly basis as it is currently processed for eligible lay employees. The Finance Office will work directly with the locations to establish correct procedure on the Fifth Third site.

CMS DATA MATCH QUESTIONAIRE

Several parishes/schools have received a letter from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) requesting completion of a CMS DATA MATCH QUESTIONAIRE. This is NOT OPTIONAL. It must be completed by the location that receives it using your Tax ID number. The Finance Office cannot complete it on your behalf. CMS has the authority to send these letters to enforce the Medicare Secondary Payer rules. The data collected is used by CMS to identify situations where an employer's group health plan should be primary to Medicare. Employers must respond to the notice by completing a questionnaire that is available online at https://www.cob.cms.hhs.gov/DataMatch/.

FESTIVAL REMINDERS

With festival season approaching, please review the following important information.

GAMBLING

The Attorney General's policy for fundraising events that include games of chance is available online: http://www.ohioattorneygeneral.gov/Files/Publications-Files/Publications-for-Non-Profits/Bingo-Publications/Policy-201-Games-of-Chance. It is a requirement that **all gambling** (except for bingo) be conducted as part of a parish festival. Under Ohio law, all gambling activities require that **volunteers** be the operators of the specific games. The only exception is the payment for security personnel.

No one under the age of eighteen (18) should be permitted to operate a game of chance with cash prizes. Persons younger than eighteen (18), however, may assist in the operation of a game so long as the prize awarded is a non-cash item.

No one under the age of eighteen (18) should be permitted to **gamble** in a game of chance for cash prizes. Persons under the age of eighteen (18), may gamble for a non-cash prize as long as the intent of the game is entertainment, such as ring toss, ball toss, pick-a-prize, etc.

Raffle Tickets and Younger Children

You should exercise prudence with regard to raffles and other schemes of chance. Young children should not be responsible for selling raffle tickets and the subsequent responsibility for accounting for the sales. For instance, no one under the age of eighteen (18) is permitted to purchase a State of Ohio lottery ticket. If an adult purchases a ticket and gives it to a person under eighteen (18), prudence dictates that if that ticket is a winner, the prize should be turned over to the parent or legal guardian of the child to avoid potential legal problems.

Information Reporting Requirements – Form W2-G (Certain Gambling Winnings) **must** be filed for each person who wins a prize with a fair market value of more than \$5,000. Such forms are also required if the winnings are more than \$600 and are at least 300 times the amount of the raffle ticket.

Income Tax Withholding – A charity must withhold (and remit to the U.S. Treasury) federal income tax on any payment exceeding \$5,000 (net of ticket cost) that is made as part of a lottery fund raiser. A raffle is considered a lottery for withholding purposes. This also applies to noncash items with a fair market value exceeding \$5,000 (net of ticket cost). The instructions for Forms W-2G and 5754 expand on the above paragraphs.

BEER

A temporary liquor permit (F) valid for the date of the festival must be obtained from the local Department of Liquor Control. Bartenders at work or any server of alcoholic beverages that knowingly serves a person under the influence of alcohol can be sued if an intoxicated person causes bodily injury or property damage. Temporary liquor permit holders cannot sell or serve an unlimited number of drinks for a one-time admission charge. Purchases of multiple cups of beer should be discouraged. If the parish wishes to allow adults to take beer into the area in which gambling is taking place, efforts should be made to control the possibility of children obtaining access to the beer. The self-insurance program of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati provides limited liquor liability coverage for all locations covered under the program. The following recommendations are to be reviewed and put into effect when possible:

- Post signs prohibiting anyone from bringing alcoholic beverages on the premises. Violators should be asked to leave the premises.
- Liquor or beer sales should be held only within a restricted, confined, roped-in or fenced-in area
- Post signs about the serving area on the legal age of drinking. The signs should also indicate that you reserve the right to verify the age of anyone wishing to purchase beer and the right to refuse to serve anyone.
- Post signs offering transportation for overindulged guests. These signs should be staffed
 by someone at all times in order to prevent an intoxicated person who may need
 assistance with transportation from wandering off.

FESTIVAL RIDES AND OUTSIDE FOOD SERVICE

For-profit vendors, who provide festival rides or food service, must have liability insurance of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) with aggregate limits of two million dollars (\$2,000,000) and provide a certificate of insurance naming Archbishop Schnurr as Trustee for the sponsoring institution as an Additional Insured for the dates of the festival.

Our Archdiocesan Insurance Underwriters will not insure any of the following activities: Paint Ball Games, Trampolines, Bungee Jumps, Bull Riding Machines, Rock Climbing Walls and Inflatable Attractions. Without insurance, the Parish/Archdiocese is 100% liable for any injuries suffered by festival participants. Accordingly, parishes and institutions may not have Paint Ball Games, Trampolines, Bungee Jumps, Bull Riding Machines, Rock Climbing Walls, or any Inflatable Attractions.

USING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AS PRIZES

Question: Under Ohio law, may a parish/school use alcoholic beverages as prizes in a raffle or silent auction (aka a "Bid 'n Buy")?

Answer: A parish/school may not use alcoholic beverages as prizes in a raffle. A parish/school may use certain alcoholic beverages as prizes in a silent auction, **but only** if the parish/school holds an F-2 or an F-6 liquor permit; **even then**, the parish/school should note that there are certain restrictions imposed on such a permit that could make holding such an auction in the context of a parish/school festival impractical.

Regarding an F-2 permit: First, an F-2 permit holder is only allowed to hold such an auction once during any calendar year. Second, the auction event cannot last for more than a 24-hour period. This would prohibit the auction of alcoholic beverages at any parish/school festival that lasts more than one day. Regarding an F-6 permit: an F-6 permit would allow a parish/school to auction off wine only, but not beer or mixed beverages. However, under Ohio law, an organization is only permitted to hold one liquor permit at a time. As a result, a parish/school holding an F-6 permit would be able to auction wine at its festival, but unable to sell beer or mixed beverages at the festival.

ACTIVE PRIEST SALARY

This information is being provided so that changes might be reflected in budgets being prepared for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016.

The base salary for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016 will be increased from the current base of \$2,413.00 to \$2,468.50 per month (\$29,622.00). This increase of 2.3% was approved by Archbishop Schnurr. The annual seniority increment is unchanged from the previous fiscal year and remains at \$201.00 per year. The limit on professional ministerial expenses of active priests is \$2,500.00 per year.

The Archdiocese, like most institutions, has been challenged by the effects of the current economic conditions. Nevertheless, the Archbishop has approved a modest wage increase this year. (Please note that Archdiocesan policy indicates that if priests wish to give back their salary, they are free to do so, but they are not free to turn down the salary completely).

From the Desk of the Senior Auditor

The Archdiocese of Cincinnati began financial reviews several years ago as a method to assist parishes and schools with their financial management. As we discussed last month, we will take the next couple of months describing why and how we conduct the financial reviews.

What is the process?

We begin by meeting with the pastor or principal and the staff to discuss our objectives and solicit their input. We discuss the timeframe, items to be tested, and any concerns that the location may have. Our goal is to be as effective and efficient as possible. We strive to be as unobtrusive to the location's staff as possible. Therefore, we request various documents prior to our arrival and/or access to the documents when we get there. We also work around the daily activities of the individual staff members to obtain answers to our questions.

We conclude by meeting with the pastor or principal and the staff to discuss preliminary findings and any outstanding items. The draft report, which will provide details and recommendations for any findings discovered during these procedures, will then be completed and reviewed by the Archdiocesan Chief Financial Officer. The draft will then be reviewed in person or by telephone with the business manager or equivalent. The draft report will be subsequently sent to the location for their comments and responses.

The finalized report containing the location's responses will be reviewed and signed by the Archdiocesan Chief Financial Officer and Senior Auditor. Signed copies will be sent to the pastor or principal, Parish Finance Committee, Pastoral Council or School Education Committee and business manager. A presentation on the results will be made to the Parish Finance Committee or School Education Committee.

The financial review report consists of two sections.

Section A is the Report on Parish Financial Reviews which provides an overview of the parish, the scope of our work, the work performed and positive statistics.

Section B is the Report on Findings, Recommendations and Responses. In this section the observations and recommendations should not be viewed as any one individual's incorrect business practices, but rather as suggestions to improve the financial and accounting procedures of the entire parish management system. In the course of our work, we may find areas where we believe the location should consider strengthening controls, by reassessing the risks, redesigning the controls, or simply improving the segregation of duties or broadening the oversight of management or supervisory efforts.

For purposes of this report:

- A FINDING is any item that potentially violates civil laws or regulations as well as policies or procedures of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. We feel that you should consider a Finding as a priority. We understand it may take time to address all of these items at once.
- **SPECIFIC ITEMS OF INTEREST** are any items involving a control or procedures that should be strengthened or improved which we believe can be addressed in a six to eight month time frame. SPECIFIC ITEMS OF INTEREST are important matters to address, but are less of a priority than FINDINGS.
- We discussed with the Business Manager or equivalent various suggestions and improvements that were deemed low risk or may be long term goals which were not included in this report.

Over the next several months we will provide examples of what documents we may examine.

UPDATED STATUS OF DEPARTMENT OF LABOR FINAL RULE

In July 2015, the Department of Labor ("DOL") released a proposed rule expanding the current overtime requirements to an additional five million workers. The proposed rule more than doubles the current salary minimum required for exempt status from \$455 per week (\$23,660 per year) to a projected level of \$970 per week (\$50,440 per year in 2016). Under the proposed rule, 40% of full-time salaried workers would lose their exempt status. The impact on parishes and schools will be significant—with the exception of teachers and the clergy, any employee who does not make the threshold salary (i.e., \$50,440 in the proposed rule) will automatically be

considered non-exempt and, therefore, subject to the minimum wage, overtime and recordkeeping requirements of the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA).

As for the implementation timeline, the final rule will probably be out by May 16 with a 60-day effective date, giving employers until July 15 to comply. This is according to Tammy McCutchen, the former administrator of the DOL's Wage and Hour Division. The reason the DOL is likely aiming for May 16 is that it is the last date for the Obama administration to publish a rule without risking it being overruled the moment a new, possibly Republican administration starts next January, said McCutchen.

Please use the above timeline as an opportunity to review your exempt/non-exempt classifications and consider how these potential changes will impact you.


