CHANCERY OFFICE

PONTIFICIAL GOOD FRIDAY 2017 COLLECTION

The Good Friday collection is to be taken up in all churches and chapels where Good Friday services are celebrated. The proceeds will help the churches in the Holy Land to minister in parishes, provide Catholic schools, offer religious education and provide funds to preserve the sacred shrines. A flyer is included with this mailing that can be placed in your bulletin or posted at your church. Please send the proceeds from the collection to the Finance Office of the Archdiocese in the week following Easter. Thank you.

LENTEN REMINDERS – FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday, March 1, 2017, and Good Friday, April 14, 2017, are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast, that is, limited to a single full meal. The other Fridays of the season of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (canons 97 and 1252). With regard to Good Friday, the teaching of the Second Vatican Council should be recalled.

Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection may be attained with uplifted and clear mind (*Constitution on the Liturgy, No. 110*).

With regard to the obligatory days listed above, however, there are frequent questions about the degree of seriousness of the matter. The teaching of Pope John Paul II may be simply paraphrased: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe an individual day of penance is not considered serious. People should seek to do more rather than less. Fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimum response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion.

CONFIRMATION AND THE FACULTY TO CONFIRM

The following might be helpful for you regarding Confirmation at the Easter Vigil. For priests who have been granted the faculties of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, these are the instructions for the Faculty to Confirm as found in the *Pagella*, Clerus Cincinnatensis, Volume XII, No. 1, pages 260-261. The mandate is given to all priests in the Archdiocese:

- 1. **to baptize and confirm** in accordance with canon 883.2 persons who are no longer infants whom the priest judges suitable for Catholic baptism;
- 2. **to admit into full communion** with the Catholic Church **and to confirm** in accordance with canon 883.2 previously baptized persons who are no longer infants whom the priest judges suitable for admission to the Catholic Church;

3. **to readmit into full communion** with the Catholic Church and **to confirm** in accordance with the response to the Pontifical Commission for the Interpretation of the Decrees of the Second Vatican Council, April 25, 1975, persons beyond infancy who were baptized Catholic but not confirmed and who later became an apostate or a heretic, whom the priest judges suitable for readmission to the Catholic Church. (If you have any questions about whether or not someone later became an apostate or a heretic, please call the Chancery.)

Priests do not have the faculty to confirm a baptized but never confirmed Catholic who simply has not been active in the practice of the faith without becoming a member of another Church and now desires to be confirmed and be actively involved in the Church's life. In these cases, individual delegation of the archbishop is needed. Priests can seek such delegation in writing from the Chancery, giving reasons why the delegation is sought, the name of the person to be delegated, the name of the candidate, and the intended date of the ceremony.

If you need to request a faculty to confirm, please do so in ample time to receive it before the Easter Vigil. Also, if you have more than one parish, please include the name of the parish where the Confirmation will take place. Thank you.

OFFICE FOR CONSECRATED LIFE

PUBLIC ASSOCIATIONS OF THE FAITHFUL

A public association of the faithful operates in the name of the Church, and has the guarantee of the Church behind its activities. Its statutes must be in accordance with Canon #1192 and require approval by competent ecclesiastical authority. In many dioceses those who have made profession in a public association of the faithful are considered to be the equivalent of "religious." Some public associations of the faithful intend to eventually become a religious institute and others do not. The Archdiocese of Cincinnati has two Public Associations of the Faithful, the Children of Mary and Regnum Christi. The women of Regnum Christi take the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience; live in community; and are considered lay; do not wear a habit; do not intend to seek the designation of a religious order. The Church has wanted to wait to see the whole configuration of the entire Regnum Christi Movement (with the lay branch, consecrated lay branches and priestly branch) which is now in the process of being discerned before granting the canonical status of Public Association of the Faithful to the consecrated women. In the meantime the Church has officially approved their statutes. The Children of Mary

take the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience; live in community; are called Sister; wear a habit; hope to be a pontifical religious institute someday.

THE INAUGURAL BROTHERS' DAY

Religious Brothers Day, May 1, 2017 came about as a direct result of asking the question: How can we continue to celebrate the Year of Consecrated Life? The Year of Consecrated Life focused the attention of the Church and the world on the special place that religious women and men hold in the Church. The Brothers Think Tank, a group formed through the Conference of Major Superiors of Men (CMSM), brainstormed ideas about how we could put forward and recognize the mission and identity of the religious brother in the Church. Religious Brothers Day is one of the fruits of those discussions. May 1 was selected because it is the feast of St. Joseph the Worker ... brothers are workers in the field. Brothers do a variety of ministries: education, social work, medical work, legal work and the list goes on. The website for RBD (http://www.yearforconsecratedlife.com/) is up and running. The site provides some practical ways, including a morning and evening prayer service, for the wider church community to celebrate the life and work of the religious brother today. PERMANENT DEACON CANDIDATES INSTALLED AS LECTORS

The twenty men who are candidates in formation were installed to the Ministry of Lector. This is the first of the minor ministries into which the men will be installed on their path towards ordination to the Permanent Diaconate. The Rite of Installation took place at the Basilica Cathedral of the Assumption, Covington, Kentucky on February 12, 2017, with the Most Reverend Roger J. Foys, Bishop of Covington, presiding at the Mass. Please keep our deacon candidates in your prayers as they continue their discernment and formation.

OFFICE OF SAFE ENVIRONMENT FOR THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN AND YOUTH

BACKGROUND CHECK / CHILD PROTECTION REQUIRMENTS

All "clergy," "employees" and "regular volunteers" as defined in the July 1, 2013 *Decree on Child Protection (Decree)* must receive an acceptable background check, and must attend a VIRTUS ® Child Awareness Session on the *Decree* before they can have contact with children. All new employees must complete both manual and an electronic background check through SELECTION.COM® at time of employment with no further requirement for a manual fingerprint completed in the future. This was effective March 1, 2015. Current employees must sign up for an electronic background check through SELECTION.COM® within five years of their last manual fingerprinting or December 31, 2018, whichever is sooner. This requirement was effective January 1, 2014. **Remember:** Manual fingerprints are completed once and not required again for Youth Protection purposes. The electronic check is completed once and it is done.

Important note: The State of Ohio has additional requirements for selected occupations which are not addressed by the *Decree*. Individuals should contact the Schools Office for assistance.

All new regular volunteers must complete an electronic background check through SELECTION.COM®. Current regular volunteers must sign up for electronic background checks through SELECTION.COM® within five years of their last manual fingerprinting or December 31, 2018, whichever is sooner. This requirement was effective January 1, 2014. **Remember:** The electronic check is completed once and it is done.

All clergy and employees who have contact with youth must have a B.4 Form completed, submitted to the Archdiocese of Cincinnati and approved prior to having contact with youth.

All clergy, employees and regular volunteers must stay current (less than three behind) on the monthly VIRTUS bulletins. This requirement was effective July 1, 2014.

VIRTUS® ACCOUNTS CLEANUP

The electronic background check through SELECTION.COM® became mandatory on January 1, 2014. Individuals who had manual fingerprints (BCI or FBI) completed in 2012 are required to complete the electronic check in 2017. Individuals who had manual fingerprints completed in 2013 are required to complete the electronic check in 2018.

The Safe Environment Office will be identifying individuals who are **significantly out of compliance** and will be inactivating their accounts on the following schedule.

March 2017 – inactivating anyone who had manual fingerprints completed July – December 2014 and did not complete an electronic check through Selection.com.

April 2017 – inactivating anyone who had manual fingerprints completed January – June 2015 and did not complete an electronic check through Selection.com.

May 2017 – inactivating anyone who had manual fingerprints completed June – December 2015 and did not complete an electronic check through Selection.com.

June 2017 – we will start inactivating anyone who had manual fingerprints completed January – June 2016 and did not complete an electronic check through Selection.com.

NON-RENEWAL/REDUCTION IN FORCE

To ensure proper procedure is followed, the Department of Human Resources wants to remind all schools of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati considering a reduction in force or non-renewal of staff, to review the guidelines that are in place.

Schools of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati strive to provide the highest level of instruction to all students. However, should economics, decrease in school enrollment, or other conditions necessitate a reduction for non-renewal of staff, school administrators will provide a standard and objective approach for reducing the size and/or composition of their teaching staff consistent with student educational needs and teacher reduction and non-renewal guidelines. A reduction in force report must be prepared by the school administrator and sent to the Director of Human Resources and the School Office Regional Director for review. Parishes considering a reduction in force of **non-school employees** should only send a report to the Director of Human Resources.

LITURGICAL CALENDAR UPDATE

The Solemnity of St. Joseph is transferred to Monday, March 20, 2017 because the Third Sunday of Lent takes precedence over the Solemnity.

Date/Time for the Easter Vigil: The Easter Vigil is on April 15. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal states that the Easter Vigil is to be celebrated in darkness. Therefore, this year the Easter Vigil may begin at 8:45 p.m. or later.

RITE OF ELECTION AND CALL TO CONTINUING CONVERSION

The Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion will take place on the **First Sunday of Lent, March 5, 2017**. An email with a link to the seating charts for the Rite of Election was emailed to all RCIA coordinators; the link also included a presider's text for the Rite of Sending and Reminders for the celebrations at the Cathedral and Immaculate Conception. These documents are also posted on the ODWS website.

SCRUTINIES

In this final period of preparation for the Sacraments of Initiation, the three Scrutinies are to be celebrated with the Elect on the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent using the Cycle A readings. (cf. RCIA, 20, 146) Please note, "The bishop may dispense from one of them for serious reasons or, in extraordinary circumstances, even from two" (RCIA, 20). In other words, these are not optional rites and should be celebrated in the context of the community of faith.

PASCHAL TRIDUUM RESOURCES

HOLY THURSDAY, WASHING OF THE FEET:

On the authority of Pope Francis, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments [CDWDS] issued a Decree and a Commentary on 6 January 2016 changing the rubric for the Washing of the Feet during the Evening Mass on Thursday of the Lord's Supper. Here is the English rubric with the edits:

Those who have been chosen from amongst the people of God are led by the ministers to seats prepared in a suitable place. Then the Priest (removing the chasuble if necessary) goes to each one, and, with the help of the ministers, pours water over each one's feet and then dries them.

By the action of the Apostolic See, those chosen for the foot washing is open to all members of the People of God – boys and girls, women and men. Those chosen for the foot washing reflect all who make up the People of God, the disciples of the Lord.

In the account of the Last Supper in the Gospel of John, the Good News proclaimed during the Holy Thursday Evening Mass, Jesus washes the feet of an unspecified number of disciples. Just as the "beloved disciple" is nameless so that it may be, in fact, every hearer who is the beloved one, the "disciples" are all of us as well. This *mandatum*, this love command to be of service, to be servants is given to each one of the baptized.

Some feet are washed during the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper as another reminder to be like Jesus. No task, no service, no gesture is beneath those who bear the name Christian.

As well as having this letter in the Mission Office they are to have one with them when they arrive at the parish. For many mission dioceses and organizations, the MCP is a major source of income to help them proclaim God's "Good News" in some very difficult parts of our world. Consequently, pastors' and parishioners' support is most appreciated.

The Mission Office has a mandatory training workshop for incoming missionaries who have not spoken in our archdiocese before. They will be held on the weekend of May 26 and 27 or June 9 and 10, 2017. We recommend that our MCP attendees ask our pastors to visit those weekends to defray the cost of travel. These workshops take place from Friday noon to Saturday noon and they insure better, shorter and more effective mission appeals.

To promote Catholic mission and global solidarity awareness among our parishioners, the Mission Office encourages our parish staffs to invite their visiting MCP missionary guests to also dialogue with parishioners between the weekend masses, visit their homes, and speak to summer bible schools, RCIA, and parish groups while the missionary is at your parish.

This formation not only benefits the teachers themselves, but also equips them to build a solid Catholic environment in our Catholic schools.
