<u>High School Graduation Requirements – Update on HB 164 section 12</u>

End of Course Exams for courses taken in school year 2019/2020

Thank you for your patience as I continued to work with ODE for clarification on HB 164 sec 12. I can now state with certainty the following information:

Any student who was enrolled in a qualifying course which requires an EOC exam during the 19-20 school year and was unable to take the EOC exam DOES NOT have to reschedule the EOC exam. The may receive graduation credit for that course. An eligible student may substitute their corresponding course grades to meet this requirement. New Archdiocesan Websites Now Live (From Susie Gibbons)

The archdiocese is revamping its web presence to more joyfully and beautifully Radiate Christ, simplify navigation, modernize functionality and segregate information intended for the public from information intended for parishes, schools and other ministries. **Effective today, Tuesday, November 3**, we will: (1) retire our current website (http://www.catholiccincinnati.org/); (2) launch a new public-facing site (https://catholicaoc.org/); and (3) launch a site for parish, school and other ministry resources (https://resources.catholicaoc.org/). The two new sites will be linked to each other. Please be aware that part of any new website launch is a post-launch punch list of items to be corrected. We will address each identified item quickly.

Two potential action items result from this:

- If your website currently links to anything on the archdiocese website, that link will need to be reset to link to the appropriate new page.
- The recent USCCB onsite safe environment audit **strongly recommended** that the website of every parish and school link to the new Report Misconduct page (<u>catholicaoc.org/report-misconduct</u>) and Restoring Trust page (<u>catholicaoc.org/restoring-trust</u>).
- The Educator Data Center will remain unchanged. You should have access like you always did.

Child Protection Compliancy Report: (From Cindy Hardesty)

The Decree on Child Protection Policy A.11 requires all schools include in their curricula training to address safe environments for children. In addition, the Catholic Schools are required to collect data that all students are trained and input the data to the template provided. The principal signs off that the data is accurate and sends the final report to their regional director. The Catholic Schools Office compiles data from all schools, sends it to the Archdiocesan Auditor. Ultimately this information is submitted to USCCB.
