ACTION REQUIRED

RITE OF ELECTION & CALL TO CONTINUING CONVERSION

Due to the ongoing public health concern, the Rite of Election & Call to Continuing Conversion will take place in **parishes** on the First Sunday of Lent (February 21, 2021), not in large archdiocesan celebrations. Archbishop Schnurr delegates the priests and deacons of the Archdiocese to celebrate this liturgy in their parishes, with preference being that the pastor celebrate the rite if possible (cf. RCIA #12, 34, 121). This replaces the Rite of Sending which would normally take place in the parish on this day (cf. RCIA #106). More guidance on celebrating this important Lenten liturgy can be found on the <u>ODWS website</u>.

OHIO MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE

On January 1, 2021, the Ohio minimum wage increased to \$8.80 per hour. The minimum wage increase is the result of a constitutional amendment passed by voters in November 2006. The amendment requires the Ohio minimum wage to increase on January 1 of each year by the rate of inflation. The increase is tied to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the prior 12-month period as of September 30, 2020. As a result of this increase, please make sure that none of your employees are being paid less than \$8.80 an hour beginning January 1, 2021. 1. Stainless-Steel

- Our columbarium unit is built out of all stainless-steel plates and custom aluminum extrusion.

2. Ceramic Inks

- We use ceramic inks to print on 3/8" thick glass, which is then tempered into the glass

3. Tempered Safety Glass

- The front, back, and sides are all typically, 3/8" safety glass. Tempering makes the glass five times stronger. The strength of tempered glass makes glass an excellent alternative to granite, and provides more versatility and choice of expression for customers.

4. Capstone

- Our capstone can be built using either granite or 3/8" thick tempered safety glass if a lighter weight option is desired.

5. Base

- The base of our unit can either be built using granite or concrete depending on the client's preference.

6. Security

- Each niche is protected by specialty stainless-steel security screws, and is also individually removable. In addition, each unit is protected from the elements by a silicone gasket.
