ACTION REQUIRED

CHANGE TO THE ROMAN MISSAL

Per a February 4, 2021 decree from the USCCB, having been confirmed by the Holy See, the formula concluding all Collect prayers in the *Roman Missal* was changed effective February 17, 2021 (Ash Wednesday). The words "one God, for ever and ever" are simply replaced with "God, for ever and ever." You can find more details including information from the USCCB and the Holy See here. GOOD FRIDAY 2021 COLLECTION

The Good Friday collection is to be taken up in all churches and chapels where Good Friday services are celebrated. The proceeds will help offer hope to Holy Land Christians by providing funds for their parishes, academic institutions, and religious education programs, as well as funds for the preservation of sacred shrines in the Holy Land. SAVE THE DATE FOR SPRING CONVOCATION FOR PRIESTS

A one-day Spring convocation for priests is scheduled for **Wednesday**, **April 21**. The Presbyteral Council has decided that the convocation will be virtual, due to COVID-19 concerns. More information will come on how to join the convocation by computer. The Presbyteral Council has also decided that there will be two main topics. The morning session will be a presentation and discussion on the topic of Racism, planned by the Peace and Justice Committee of the Presbyteral Council. This is tentatively scheduled to begin at 10:00 a.m. (earlier than an in-person convocation, since priests will not have to drive to the convocation venue). The afternoon session will be led by Fr. Jan Schmidt on the *Beacons of Light*. The precise starting time for the afternoon session will be communicated with other final details in early April.

OHIO MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE

On January 1, 2021, the Ohio minimum wage increased to \$8.80 per hour. The minimum wage increase is the result of a constitutional amendment passed by voters in November 2006. The amendment requires the Ohio minimum wage to increase on January 1 of each year by the rate of inflation. The increase is tied to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the prior 12-month period as of September 30, 2020. As a result of this increase, **please make sure that none of your employees are being paid less than \$8.80 an hour beginning January 1, 2021**. MARIAN PILGRIMAGE 2021: CALLING ALL STATUE GUARDIAN PILGRIMS!

Pastors, please help us share the following information with your staff. Our archdiocesan Marian Pilgrimage takes place May 16 - June 19, ending at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Peter in Chains on the actual date of the bicentennial. We are in need of Statue Guardians committed to walking at least three full days of the pilgrimage route. Guardians will have the important role of being part of a core team that carries the statue and leads daily prayers.

Statue Guardians will have the opportunity to challenge themselves both spiritually and physically, as they will walk at least 40 miles per leg and be expected to help carry (in a team of 4) a 50-pount Mary statue on a platform for 6-15 miles per day, rotating out during the day.

The maximum number of guardians per leg is 10, so don't delay in signing up! There will be a \$25 non-refundable deposit, which includes a water bottle, t-shirt, and a commemorative gift. All participants are required to have completed the VIRTUS Safe Environment course.

START TIME FOR THE EASTER VIGIL

The *Roman Missal* specifies that the Easter Vigil "must take place during the night, so that it begins after nightfall...". In the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, the Easter Vigil for 2021 should begin NO EARLIER THAN 8:45 p.m., and preferably at 9:00 p.m. (This will be the case at least through 2024 as well.)

THE LIGHT IS ON FOR YOU

This annual archdiocesan-wide synchronous celebration of the Sacrament of Penance will **not** take place in 2021. As always, parishes are encouraged to ensure ample opportunity for the faithful to celebrate this sacrament.

GUIDELINES FOR NON-RENEWAL/REDUCTION-IN-FORCE

To ensure proper procedure is followed, the Department of Human Resources wants to remind all Schools of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati considering a reduction in force or non-renewal of staff, to review the <u>guidelines</u> that are in place.

Schools of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati strive to provide the highest level of instruction to all students. However, should economics, decrease in school enrollment, or other conditions necessitate a reduction for non-renewal of staff, school administrators will provide a standard and objective approach for reducing the size and/or composition of their teaching staff consistent with student educational needs and teacher reduction and non-renewal guidelines. A reduction in force report

must be prepared by the school administrator and sent to the Director of Human Resources and the School Office Regional Director for review. Parishes considering a reduction in force of non-school employees should only send a report to the Director of Human Resources.


