The Abortion Ballot Initiative: We Must Not Remain Silent Bv: Bob Wurzelbacher

Last month, I mentioned the initiative pro-abortion groups are attempting to instill in our constitution, with deliberately vague language that would nullify even reasonable abortion restrictions the vast majority of people agree with (such as parental notification laws, safety standards and abortion for reasons of disability) and replace it with Protect Women Ohio

essentially abortion on demand for any reason. These groups have already begun collecting the over 400,000 signatures they will need to successfully get this on the ballot in November.

Since then, a coalition of life and family leaders (including the Ohio Catholic Conference and our local right-to-life organizations) have joined the Center for Christian Virtue to launch the new website **ProtectWomenOhio.com**, focused on defeating this initiative. There, you can watch the FIRST COMMERCIAL aimed at educating the public on the dangers of this



extreme amendment.

If you want more details on the truth behind that commercial, please check out the video or podcast versions of my latest **BEING PRO LIFE** interview with Peter Range, Executive Director of Ohio Right to Life, where we go through the actual text of the amendment to explain how the language is deliberately nebulous to

create a situation where laws that attempt to limit abortion could easily be interpreted as unconstitutional.

So what can we do? First of all, we invite everyone to say a quick prayer with your family every day at 7:14 (AM and PM). That time is based on 2 Chronicles 7:14; "if my people, who are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land." You should also make specific commitments of fasting related to this issue, even during the Easter Season. You can also get directly involved in efforts to stop people from signing the initiative so it never gets on the ballot. In our area, learn about Decline to Sign events through CINCINNATI RIGHT TO LIFE or DAYTON RIGHT TO LIFE.

As I shared last month, the Catholic Conference of Ohio already disseminated a LETTER to all pastors, warning the faithful about the coming initiative. A lot more will be coming from the Conference in the upcoming weeks and months, including resources on prayer, educational materials to hand out, and homily helps for pastors. In the meantime, continue directing people to my BEING PRO LIFE page, ProtectWomenOhio.com, and our local Stop the Sign initiatives. May our voices be one as we pray:

God our loving Father, grant wisdom to those who govern us, compassion and courage to those who work to defend human life, and safety and care to every human being. For you alone who formed us in our mothers' wombs, and who call us home to heaven, are God, for ever and ever. Amen

Death Penalty Bill Update

The Ohio Senate bill calling for an end to capital punishment in Ohio has been filed and features more robust bipartisan support than ever before. This year, the bill is co-sponsored by all seven Senate Democrats and five Senate Republicans. If passed, this bill would repeal the death penalty, replacing it with a sentence of life in prison without the possiiblity of



parole. This is an exciting moment for the anti-death penalty movement and the **NO DEATH PENALTY OHIO COALITION** (fully supported by the Catholic Conference of Ohio) as we continue to make history in the efforts to repeal Ohio's death penalty. Respect Life Coordinator Resources

- 01 The month's WORD OF LIFE focuses on healing after an abortion. As always, this includes bulletin quotes and images, and intercessions for life designed for each Sunday of the month you can share with your pastor or liturgical leaders. Also available in SPANISH.
- The Secretariat for Pro-Life Activities has created a DIVINE MERCY ACTION GUIDE featuring a simple timeline, sample announcements, and an activity to help you bring Christ's message of mercy to your parish communities, homily helps for Divine Mercy Sunday, intercessions, announcements, and even a sample PRAYER SERVICE FOR FORGIVENESS AND HEALING. Also, pass alolng to your pastor this resource called HOMILY CONSIDERATIONS REGARDING HEALING AFTER AN ABORTION.
- O3 The U.S. Department of Health & Human Services is proposing yet another version of its contraceptive mandate, requiring most employers' health insurance plans to cover contraception, sterilization, and some abortion-causing drugs for free for employees and their dependents. - 04 In addition to the contraceptive mandate, the Department of Justice often attempts to issue mandates that hamper Christian ministries by requiring them to go against long-held beliefs about things such as gender, marriage and religious liberty. At Roger Bacon High School, we take seriously the Catholic Social Teaching of respecting the life and dignity of the human person. This call to respect life is answered in multiple ways through the Roger Bacon spiritual life ministries. We try, through various activities, to communicate and engage students with a "consistent ethic of life" approach. The various ways in which we do this are: engaging in Adoration to pray for all life,

attending the March for Life in D.C. each year, however, for the 2023-24 school year we will march on the state level, in Columbus, on October 6. We engage in feeding the hungry through salvation sandwiches, caring for the elderly through our monthly BINGO engagements, reaching out to those in prison through Writing Hope, bringing awareness to mental health and suicide prevention through our service learning initiatives, helping to empower and engage with students who may be "at risk" through our Bacon Buddies program, decorating and putting together care packages that give the sick and dying hope for the journey through suffering, and so much more! We also have our own St. Vincent de Paul chapter, engaging students in systemic changes to end homelessness, and address issues of poverty.

Some of our families used an adapted version of the Act of Contrition




