St. Vincent de Paul is a faith-based 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization serving the Greater Dayton Area. We provide help to individuals and families who are on the brink of losing their housing, those who are currently homeless, and those working to secure and maintain permanent housing.

Assistance is provided through parish-based Conferences, which are located in neighborhoods throughout Montgomery County, as well as at two emergency shelters.

St. Vincent de Paul operates the only two 24/7 emergency shelters in the Dayton area: one for single women and families with children, and one for single men. The shelters provide three meals daily, clothing, personal care items, mail and message services, and access to case managers who help our guests find appropriate housing to meet their individual/family needs.
