# **Local and State Advocacy**

Take a look into these State Bills

**HB 79 Permit Electric Distribution Utility Establish Certain Portfolios** 

This bill allows for energy distribution utilities to establish energy efficiency and demand reduction portfolios to allow for a more moderate distribution of energy.

Check it's status here. The final hearing for this bill was cancelled and the legislature will reset at the end of this year. We can keep an eye out for a chance to be reintroduced in the next legislative session.

#### HB 197 Establish community solar pilot and solar development programs

This bill presents Ohioans with an opportunity to lower their electricity bills while enjoying a cleaner electricity grid. Catholic Conference submitted <u>testimony</u> on it. <u>You can advocate for it here</u>. <u>Check it's status here</u>. <u>Unfortunately, this bill did not pass the House this year. Let's pray for a possibility for reintroduction next year!</u>

# **Eco-Tips**

**December:** HEATING

- 1. EASY: Winter heating: Change the air filter on your furnace once per month during the heating season. A dirty filter restricts air flow and causes the system to run less efficiently.
- 2. CHALLENGING: Inspect the ductwork in exposed areas (basement or attic). Repair any leaks from electrical lines, plumbing, and gas pipes from

outdoors. Seal with foam insulation OR, if your heating system is in need of repair, replace it with an ENERGY STAR®-certified furnace, boiler or heat pump.

### January: STARTING A NEW YEAR

- 1. EASY: Review 2024 with an environmental eye. Make at least one New Year's Resolution that involves an environmentally friendly new practice.
- 2. CHALLENGING: Looking ahead to 2025 and knowing that global warming remains a serious threat, decide one political or public action you can take to influence positive systemic environmental progress.

## February: FOOD

- 1. EASY: Ease up on the meat and cheese; consider chicken and wild fish instead.
- 2. CHALLENGING: Buy locally sourced and organic food. It is estimated that food production and transportation account for 13 percent of all greenhouse gas emissions in the USA, primarily in the form of fuel and fertilizer.

# **Laudate Deum Action Pledge**

In honor of the Pope's new exhortation, the <u>Catholic Climate Covenant</u> has created a new way to pledge action and commitment.

In Laudate Deum, Pope Francis calls "all people of good will" to take action on the climate crisis and "move beyond the mentality of appearing to be concerned but not having the courage needed to produce substantial changes." (LD 56) He particularly calls on us in the United States to make personal changes to our consumerist lifestyles, reduce our fossil fuel use, and to also advocate for systemic actions to address the climate crisis.

Together we can courageously commit to specific actions that will produce a much needed culture shift and produce a better future for our common home.
