The first focused on Sister Dorothy Stang who was killed standing up for the Amazon and the local farmers against wealthy ranchers. It was virtual, based off of the pilgrimage in Dayton that took place last spring. Hosted at the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, hearing the stories of Dorothy from those who knew her and are intimately knowledgeable of her journey made her spirit come alive. It was a beautiful, emotional, and inspiring time for all who could attend and reflect together.

The second pilgrimage visited sites across northwest Dayton. It was a beautiful day! A little cool in the morning but clear and warm by the end. It was a reminder to be grateful for the sun and the life it gives, but it was also a reminder of the challenges many of our farmers are facing. With very little rain over the summer, I am observing how affected farms and gardens have been, with the impacts not just in grocery stores but in local food pantries' ability to supply fresh fruits and vegetables to those most in need.

We must be grateful for all aspects of Creation, like the sun *and* the rain, as one does not nourish life without the other.

As we move into fall, let's remind ourselves to not take God's gifts for granted. In this time of harvest when the harvest is low, do not forget to be generous to those without and share God's gifts and His Abundant Love with others.



Celebrating Laudato Si' Communities!

On May 1st, 2025, the Archdiocese celebrated 4 new Laudato Si' Communities at Moeller High School!

For the next few issues, we will introduce them to you.

The **St. Bernard Laudato Si' Committee** met for the first time in December 2023. From that first meeting, members expressed a strong interest in facilitating the practice of the three R's—Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle—among parishioners. Parish tours were organized at the Rumpke single-stream recycling center in St. Bernard and at the Cincinnati Recycling & Reuse Center in Queengate. This summer parishioners will tour the Rumpke Landfill in Colerain Township.

To encourage recycling, educational displays and brief presentations on curbside recycling and the use of Rumpke orange bags was included as part of monthly parish breakfasts. In April of this year, they launched a first effort to collect onsite at St. Bernard selected items not appropriate for curbside bins—items ranging from #1 rigid plastics to Styrofoam—which will be delivered to the Cincinnati Recycling & Reuse Hub on a regular basis. Right now, committee members are awaiting the flowering of the pollinator garden they planted on parish grounds last fall.

Future plans include a program on solar panels and education about the importance of reuse in care for creation—and a redo of the parish household survey to see what impact the committee is having on parishioner practices.



ADVOCATE

Farm Bill

The Farm Bill is a massive piece of legislation that supports farms, foreign aid, and food assistance. Every five years is up for reauthorization. When it was up for reauthorization last year, due to the continued troubles our Congress is having, they decided to pass a temporary extension of the current funding levels for an extra year.

The American Relief Act has extended the current (and outdated) bill to September 20, 2025.

Keep reminding our members of Congress how important this bill is and encourage them to work for increased support for our farmers, our sisters and brothers around the world, and those who are struggling with food insecurity here in our country.



Eco-Tips

September: LAUNDRY

1. EASY: Only wash laundry items when necessary. You can get more than one wear out of many clothing items before they need cleaning.

2. CHALLENGING: Avoid using laundry detergents that come in plastic containers. Consider paper-like alternatives like Earth Breeze (https://earthbreeze.com/) which comes in liquid-less eco sheets.

October: GARBAGE

- 1. EASY: Do a waste audit in your household and track your garbage for the next week. Where can you make changes to reduce your impact?
- 2. CHALLENGING: How much of your recycling bin is filled with paper bills? Most companies and organizations now have paperless billing/notification options. Time to make the switch?

November: SHARING

- 1. EASY: If you have leftover food, extra supplies (pens/pencils/tools) share it with neighbors.
- 2. CHALLENGING: Even better, find a way to share with those who don't have the money to buy it themselves. Investigate local charities and donate to those who need stuff more than you do. For reusable supplies check the *Cincinnati Recycling and Reuse Hub* website.

Laudate Deum Action Pledge

In honor of the Pope's new exhortation, the <u>Catholic Climate Covenant</u> has created a new way to pledge action and commitment.

In Laudate Deum, Pope Francis calls "all people of good will" to take action on the climate crisis and "move beyond the mentality of appearing to be concerned but not having the courage needed to produce substantial changes." (LD 56) He particularly calls on us in the United States to make personal changes to our consumerist lifestyles, reduce our fossil fuel use, and to also advocate for systemic actions to address the climate crisis.

Together we can courageously commit to specific actions that will produce a much needed culture shift and produce a better future for our common home.
