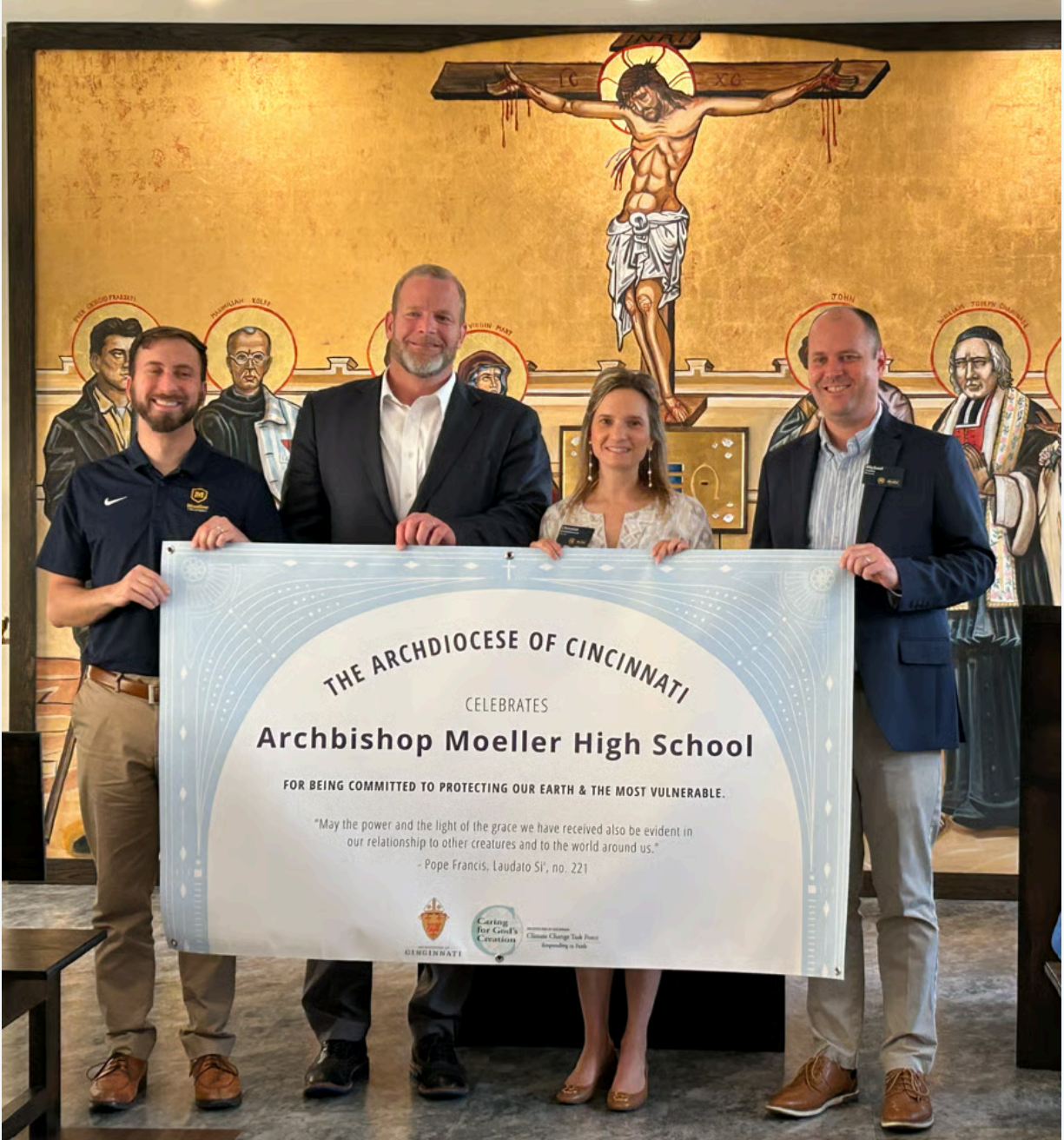
Laudato Si' Sector Sessions

Celebrating Laudato Si' Communities!

On May 1st, 2025, the Archdiocese celebrated 4 new Laudato Si' Communities at Moeller High School!

For the next few issues, we will introduce them to you.

Moeller High School took a two-pronged approach to incorporating Caring for God's Creation and the message of Laudato Si into the school culture. The approach emphasized both education and action. On the education side, Moeller incorporated lessons emphasizing Caring for God's Creation across the curriculum. This began with the entire school reading the novel *Dry* during the summer of 2023. Throughout the year, there were guest speakers, classroom activities, and ultimately a symposium featuring student research on the environment.

On the action side, Moeller moved to a zero-waste cafeteria. This involved moving to reusable dishes and silverware. Additionally, Moeller began composting all food waste. As a result, the Moeller cafeteria is sending near zero garbage to the landfill.

Farm Bill

The Farm Bill is a massive piece of legislation that supports farms, foreign aid, and food assistance. Every five years is up for reauthorization. When it was up for reauthorization last year, due to the continued troubles our Congress is having, they decided to pass a temporary extension of the current funding levels for an extra year.

The American Relief Act has extended the current (and outdated) bill to September 20, 2025.

Other Advocacy

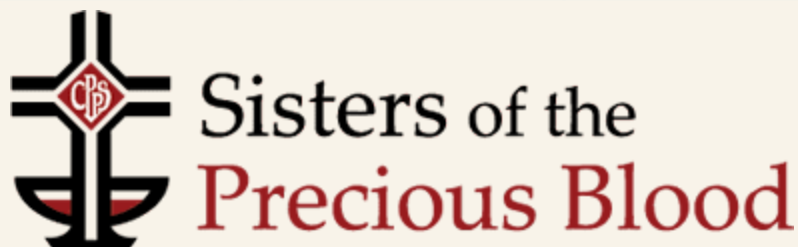
Keep an eye on these bills:

HB 471 – Fix Our Forests Act – for wildfire prevention and supports environmental work in forests. BUT there is concern about possible permissions for loggers to be more active. It has bipartisan support, but environmental agencies are split. The Catholic Conference has not spoken on it.

January: NEW YEARS

1. EASY: Remember at least one happy/joyful occasion from 2025. Share it.
2. CHALLENGING: Looking ahead to 2026, identify at least one improvement you want to make in your lifestyle – perhaps buying less, perhaps being kinder to those who have different opinions than you, perhaps...

February: FOOD

1. EASY: Research indicates that Americans throw out about 40% of their food. Don't be part of this statistic. Only buy what you need.

2. CHALLENGING: When possible, buy food without the packaging, especially plastic packaging.

March: PLASTIC REDUCTION

1. EASY: Avoid black plastic food containers. They are almost impossible to recycle because they may contain toxic chemicals.
2. CHALLENGING: Buy sauces, condiments, and oils in glass jars when possible. When empty, wash and reuse.



Laudate Deum Action Pledge

In honor of the Pope's new exhortation, the [Catholic Climate Covenant](#) has created a new way to pledge action and commitment.

In *Laudate Deum*, Pope Francis calls “all people of good will” to take action on the climate crisis and “*move beyond the mentality of appearing to be concerned but not having the courage needed to produce substantial changes.*” (LD 56) He particularly calls on us in the United States to make personal changes to our consumerist lifestyles, reduce our fossil fuel use, and to also advocate for systemic actions to address the climate crisis.

Together we can courageously commit to specific actions that will produce a much needed culture shift and produce a better future for our common home.
